**ORDER (I) AUTHORIZING THE SALE OF 201 MAIN STREET, CARBONDALE,
COLORADO PROPERTY (UNITS 101, 102, 202, 203, 204, 303) OWNED BY THE
DEBTORS FREE AND CLEAR OF LIENS, CLAIMS, ENCUMBRANCES, AND OTHER
INTERESTS; (II) APPROVING RELATED PURCHASE AGREEMENT; AND
(III) GRANTING RELATED RELIEF**

Upon the motion (the “Motion”)² filed by the above-captioned debtors and debtors in possession (collectively, the “Debtors”) in these chapter 11 cases (the “Chapter 11 Cases”) for entry of an order (i) authorizing the sale (the “Sale”) of real property owned by the Debtors Anchorpoint Investments LLC & Carbondale Spruce 101 LLC (the “Seller”) located at 201 Main Street, Carbondale, Colorado (Units 101, 102, 202, 203, 204, 303) (the “Land”), together with Seller’s right, title, and interest in and to the buildings located thereon and any other improvements and fixtures located thereon (collectively, the “Improvements” and together with the Land, the “Real Property”), and any and all of the Seller’s right, title, and interest in and to the tangible personal property and equipment remaining on the Real Property as of the date of the closing of the Sale (collectively, the “Personal Property” and, together with the Real

Property, the "Property") on an "as is, where is" basis, free and clear of any and all liens, claims, encumbrances, and other interests to Tyler Moebius (together with any assignee, the "Purchaser") pursuant to the terms and conditions of that certain Contract to Buy and Sell Real Estate (Colorado) dated as of April 30, 2018 (as may be amended, supplemented, or otherwise modified from time to time, the "Purchase Agreement") by and between the Seller and the Purchaser, a copy of which is attached as Exhibit 1 hereto; (ii) authorizing and approving the terms of the Purchase Agreement, and (iii) granting certain related relief; and the Court having jurisdiction to consider the Motion and the relief requested therein in accordance with 28 U.S.C. §§ 157 and 1334; and the Court having found that good and sufficient cause exists for granting the Motion; and it appearing that the relief requested in the Motion is appropriate in the context of these Chapter 11 Cases and in the best interests of the Debtors and their respective estates, their creditors, and all other parties-in-interest; and it appearing that notice of the Motion was adequate and proper under the circumstances of these Chapter 11 Cases, and that no other or further notice need be given; and after due deliberation and sufficient cause appearing therefor,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:

1. The Motion is GRANTED as set forth herein.
2. The Purchase Agreement is authorized and approved in its entirety.
3. Pursuant to sections 105 and 363 of the Bankruptcy Code, the Debtors are authorized, in their discretion and in the exercise of their business judgment, to sell the Property pursuant to the Purchase Agreement free and clear of all liens, claims, interests, and encumbrances, to perform all obligations under the Purchase Agreement (including payment of the Broker Fees and the Other Closing Costs out of the proceeds of the Sale), and to take any other reasonable actions that may be necessary in the Debtors' good faith business judgment to

effectuate closing of the Sale, and that any actions taken by the Debtors necessary or desirable to consummate such transactions prior to the entry of this Order are hereby ratified.

4. The Debtors and any intermediary financial institution, title company, and closing attorney participating in the closings of the Sale are authorized to transfer title and deed property, and take any other actions as may be necessary to transfer ownership of the Property to the Purchaser.

5. All persons and entities holding liens, claims, interests or encumbrances with respect to the Property are hereby barred from asserting such liens, claims, interests or encumbrances against the Purchaser, its successors or assigns, or the Property.

6. All proceeds of the Sale (net of the Broker Fees and Other Closing Costs) shall be paid to the Debtors into the general account of Debtor Woodbridge Group of Companies, LLC, and such net proceeds shall be disbursed and otherwise treated by the Debtors in accordance with the *Final Order on Debtors' Motion for Entry of Interim and Final Orders (I) Pursuant to 11 U.S.C. §§ 105, 361, 362, 363, 364, 507, and 552 Authorizing Debtors to (A) Obtain Postpetition Secured Financing, (B) Use Cash Collateral, (C) Grant Adequate Protection to Prepetition Secured Parties; (II) Modifying the Automatic Stay; (III) Scheduling a Final Hearing Pursuant to Bankruptcy Rules 4001(B) and 4001(C); and (IV) Granting Related Relief.*

7. The Debtors are authorized and empowered to pay the Broker Fees in an amount up to 6% of the gross sale proceeds.

8. The Purchase Agreement is undertaken by the Debtors and Purchaser in good faith and that, pursuant to Bankruptcy Code § 363(m), the reversal or modification on appeal of any sale consummated pursuant to the terms of this Order shall not affect the validity of such sale unless such sale was stayed pending appeal.

9. Filing of a copy of this Order in the county in which the Property is situated may be relied upon by all title insurers in order to issue title insurance policies on the Property.

10. Any title insurer, escrow agent, or other intermediary participating in a closing of the Sale of the Property is authorized to disburse all funds at the closing of the Sale pursuant to the applicable settlement statement or escrow instructions provided by the parties to such Sale.

11. The Debtors shall be authorized and empowered to take any necessary actions to implement and effectuate the terms of this Order.

12. The terms and conditions of this Order shall be immediately effective and enforceable upon its entry notwithstanding any applicability of Bankruptcy Rule 6004(h).


13. The terms and provisions of this Order and any actions taken pursuant hereto shall (i) survive entry of any order converting the Debtors' cases to chapter 7 or dismissing the Debtors' cases (or any of them), and (ii) continue in this or any superseding case under the Bankruptcy Code of any of the Debtors.

14. The provisions of this Order shall be binding upon the Debtors and their successors and assigns, including, without limitation, any trustee or other fiduciary hereafter appointed as legal representative of the Debtors or with respect to property of the estates of the Debtors, whether under chapter 11 of the Bankruptcy Code, any confirmed plan, or any subsequent chapter 7 case.

15. Notice of the Motion as provided therein shall be deemed good and sufficient notice of such motion and to have satisfied Bankruptcy Rule 6004(a).

16. This Court shall retain jurisdiction and power with respect to all matters arising from or related to the interpretation and implementation of this Order.

AGREEMENT

1. AGREEMENT. Buyer agrees to buy and Seller agrees to sell, the Property described below on the terms and conditions set forth in this contract (Contract).

2. PARTIES AND PROPERTY.

2.1. Buyer. Buyer, *Tyler Moebius and/or assigns*, will take title to the Property described below as

2.2. No Assignability. This Contract is **Not** assignable by Buyer unless otherwise specified in **Additional Provisions**.

2.3. Seller. Seller, *Anchorpoint Investments LLC & Carbondale Spruce 101 LLC*, is the current owner of the Property described below.

2.4. Property. The Property is the following legally described real estate in the County of Garfield, Colorado:

101,102, 202, 203, 204 and 303

known as No. **201 Main Street, Carbondale, CO 81623**,

together with the interests, easements, rights, benefits, improvements and attached fixtures appurtenant thereto, and all interest of Seller in vacated streets and alleys adjacent thereto, except as herein excluded (Property).

2.5. Inclusions. The Purchase Price includes the following items (Inclusions):

2.5.1. Inclusions - Attached. If attached to the Property on the date of this Contract, the following items are included unless excluded under **Exclusions**: lighting, heating, plumbing, ventilating and air conditioning units, TV antennas, inside telephone, network and coaxial (cable) wiring and connecting blocks/jacks, plants, mirrors, floor coverings, intercom systems, built-in kitchen appliances, sprinkler systems and controls, built-in vacuum systems (including accessories), garage door openers (including all remote controls). If checked, the following are owned by the Seller and included (leased items should be listed under **Due Diligence Documents**):
 None **Solar Panels** **Water Softeners** **Security Systems** **Satellite Systems** (including satellite dishes). If any additional items are attached to the Property after the date of this Contract, such additional items are also included in the Purchase Price.

2.5.2. Inclusions - Not Attached. If on the Property, whether attached or not, on the date of this Contract, the following items are included unless excluded under **Exclusions**: storm windows, storm doors, window and porch shades, awnings, blinds, screens, window coverings and treatments, curtain rods, drapery rods, fireplace inserts, fireplace screens, fireplace grates, heating stoves, storage sheds, carbon monoxide alarms, smoke/fire detectors and all keys.

2.5.3. Personal Property - Conveyance. Any personal property must be conveyed at Closing by Seller free and clear of all taxes (except personal property taxes for the year of Closing), liens and encumbrances, except All FF&E currently in the above referenced units.

72 Conveyance of all personal property will be by bill of sale or other applicable legal instrument.

 90 of Natural Resources (Division), Buyer must complete a registration of existing well form for the well and pay the
 91 cost of registration. If no person will be providing a closing service in connection with the transaction, Buyer must
 92 file the form with the Division within sixty days after Closing. The Well Permit # is **n/a**.

3.1. **Applicability of Terms.** Any box checked in this Contract means the corresponding provision applies. Any box, blank or line in this Contract left blank or completed with the abbreviation "N/A", or the word "Deleted" means such provision, including any deadline, is not applicable and the corresponding provision of this Contract to which reference is made is deleted. If no box is checked in a provision that contains a selection of "None", such provision means that "None" applies.

The abbreviation "MEC" (mutual execution of this Contract) means the date upon which both parties have signed this Contract.

4. **PURCHASE PRICE AND TERMS.**

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4.2. **Seller Concession.** At Closing, Seller will credit to Buyer \$ n/a (Seller Concession). The Seller Concession may be used for any Buyer fee, cost, charge or expenditure to the extent the amount is allowed by the Buyer's tender and is included in the Closing Statement or Closing Disclosure, at Closing. Examples of allowable items to be paid for by the Seller Concession include, but are not limited to: Buyer's closing costs, loan discount points, loan origination fees, prepaid items and any other fee, cost, charge, expense or expenditure. Seller Concession is in addition to any sum Seller has agreed to pay or credit Buyer elsewhere in this Contract.

4.3. **Earnest Money.** The Earnest Money set forth in this section, in the form of a check or electronic transfer, will be payable to and held by title company (Earnest Money Holder), in its trust account, on behalf of both Seller and Buyer. The Earnest Money deposit must be tendered, by Buyer, with this Contract unless the parties mutually agree to an **Alternative Earnest Money Deadline** for its payment. The parties authorize delivery of the Earnest Money deposit to the company conducting the Closing (Closing Company), if any, at or before Closing. In the event Earnest Money Holder has agreed to have interest on Earnest Money deposits transferred to a fund established for the purpose of providing affordable housing to Colorado residents, Seller and Buyer acknowledge and agree that any interest accruing on the Earnest Money deposited with the Earnest Money Holder in this transaction will be transferred to such fund.

4.3.1. **Alternative Earnest Money Deadline.** The deadline for delivering the Earnest Money, if other than at the time of tender of this Contract, is as set forth as the **Alternative Earnest Money Deadline**.

4.3.2. **Return of Earnest Money.** If Buyer has a Right to Terminate and timely terminates, Buyer is entitled to the return of Earnest Money as provided in this Contract. If this Contract is terminated as set forth in § 25 and, except as provided in § 24, if the Earnest Money has not already been returned following receipt of a Notice to Terminate, Seller agrees to execute and return to Buyer or Broker working with Buyer, written mutual instructions (e.g., Earnest Money Release form), within three days of Seller's receipt of such form.

4.4. **Form of Funds; Time of Payment; Available Funds.**

4.4.1. **Good Funds.** All amounts payable by the parties at Closing, including any loan proceeds, Cash at Closing and closing costs, must be in funds that comply with all applicable Colorado laws, including electronic transfer funds, certified check, savings and loan teller's check and cashier's check (Good Funds).

4.4.2. **Time of Payment; Available Funds.** All funds, including the Purchase Price to be paid by Buyer, must be paid before or at Closing or as otherwise agreed in writing between the parties to allow disbursement by Closing Company at Closing **OR SUCH NONPAYING PARTY WILL BE IN DEFAULT**. Buyer represents that Buyer, as of the date of this Contract, Does Does Not have funds that are immediately verifiable and available in an amount not less than the amount stated as Cash at Closing in § 4.1.

285 **6. APPRAISAL PROVISIONS.**

286 **6.1. Appraisal Definition.** An "Appraisal" is an opinion of value prepared by a licensed or certified appraiser,
287 engaged on behalf of Buyer or Buyer's lender, to determine the Property's market value (Appraised Value). The
288 Appraisal may also set forth certain lender requirements, replacements, removals or repairs necessary on or to the
289 Property as a condition for the Property to be valued at the Appraised Value.

290 **6.2. Appraisal Condition.** The applicable appraisal provision set forth below applies to the respective
291 loan type set forth in § 4.5.3, or if a cash transaction (i.e. no financing), § 6.2.1 applies.

292 **6.2.1. Conventional/Other.** Buyer has the right to obtain an Appraisal. If the Appraised Value is
293 less than the Purchase Price, or if the Appraisal is not received by Buyer on or before **Appraisal Deadline** Buyer
294 may, on or before **Appraisal Objection Deadline**, notwithstanding § 8.3 or § 13:

295 **6.2.1.1. Notice to Terminate.** Notify Seller in writing that this Contract is terminated; or

296 **6.2.1.2. Appraisal Objection.** Deliver to Seller a written objection accompanied by either a
297 copy of the Appraisal or written notice from lender that confirms the Appraisal Value is less than the Purchase
298 Price.

299 **6.2.1.3. Appraisal Resolution.** If an Appraisal Objection is received by Seller, on or before
300 **Appraisal Objection Deadline**, and if Buyer and Seller have not agreed in writing to a settlement thereof on or
301 before **Appraisal Resolution Deadline** (§ 3), this Contract will terminate on the **Appraisal Resolution Deadline**,
302 unless Seller receives Buyer's written withdrawal of the Appraisal Objection before such termination, i.e., on or
303 before expiration of **Appraisal Resolution Deadline**.

304 **6.3. Lender Property Requirements.** If the lender imposes any requirements, replacements, removals or
305 repairs, including any specified in the Appraisal (Lender Requirements) to be made to the Property (e.g., roof
306 repair, repainting), beyond those matters already agreed to by Seller in this Contract, Seller has the Right to
307 Terminate under § 25.1, (notwithstanding § 10 of this Contract), on or before three days following Seller's receipt of
308 the Lender Requirements, in Seller's sole subjective discretion. Seller's Right to Terminate in this § 6.3 does not
309 apply if, on or before any termination by Seller pursuant to this § 6.3: (1) the parties enter into a written agreement
310 regarding the Lender Requirements; or (2) the Lender Requirements have been completed; or (3) the satisfaction
311 of the Lender Requirements is waived in writing by Buyer.

312 **6.4. Cost of Appraisal.** Cost of the Appraisal to be obtained after the date of this Contract must be timely
313 paid by Buyer Seller. The cost of the Appraisal may include any and all fees paid to the appraiser, appraisal
314 management company, lender's agent or all three.

315 **7. OWNERS' ASSOCIATION.** This Section is applicable if the Property is located within a Common
316 Interest Community and subject to such declaration.

317 **7.1. Common Interest Community Disclosure.** THE PROPERTY IS LOCATED WITHIN A
318 COMMON INTEREST COMMUNITY AND IS SUBJECT TO THE DECLARATION FOR THE COMMUNITY. THE
319 OWNER OF THE PROPERTY WILL BE REQUIRED TO BE A MEMBER OF THE OWNERS' ASSOCIATION
320 FOR THE COMMUNITY AND WILL BE SUBJECT TO THE BYLAWS AND RULES AND REGULATIONS OF
321 THE ASSOCIATION. THE DECLARATION, BYLAWS, AND RULES AND REGULATIONS WILL IMPOSE
322 FINANCIAL OBLIGATIONS UPON THE OWNER OF THE PROPERTY, INCLUDING AN OBLIGATION TO PAY
323 ASSESSMENTS OF THE ASSOCIATION. IF THE OWNER DOES NOT PAY THESE ASSESSMENTS, THE
324 ASSOCIATION COULD PLACE A LIEN ON THE PROPERTY AND POSSIBLY SELL IT TO PAY THE DEBT.
325 THE DECLARATION, BYLAWS, AND RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE COMMUNITY MAY PROHIBIT THE
326 OWNER FROM MAKING CHANGES TO THE PROPERTY WITHOUT AN ARCHITECTURAL REVIEW BY THE
327 ASSOCIATION (OR A COMMITTEE OF THE ASSOCIATION) AND THE APPROVAL OF THE ASSOCIATION.
328 PURCHASERS OF PROPERTY WITHIN THE COMMON INTEREST COMMUNITY SHOULD INVESTIGATE
329 THE FINANCIAL OBLIGATIONS OF MEMBERS OF THE ASSOCIATION. PURCHASERS SHOULD
330 CAREFULLY READ THE DECLARATION FOR THE COMMUNITY AND THE BYLAWS AND RULES AND
331 REGULATIONS OF THE ASSOCIATION.

332 **7.2. Owners' Association Documents.** Owners' Association Documents (Association Documents)
333 consist of the following:

334 **7.2.1.** All Owners' Association declarations, articles of incorporation, bylaws, articles of
335 organization, operating agreements, rules and regulations, party wall agreements;

336 **7.2.2.** Minutes of most recent annual owners' meeting;

337 **7.2.3.** Minutes of any directors' or managers' meetings during the six-month period immediately
338 preceding the date of this Contract. If none of the preceding minutes exist, then the most recent minutes, if any (§§
339 7.2.1, 7.2.2 and 7.2.3, collectively, Governing Documents); and

340 **7.2.4.** The most recent financial documents which consist of: (1) annual and most recent

356 balance sheet, (2) annual and most recent income and expenditures statement, (3) annual budget, (4) reserve
357 study, and (5) notice of unpaid assessments, if any (collectively, Financial Documents).

358 **7.3. Association Documents to Buyer.**

360 **7.3.1. Seller to Provide Association Documents.** Seller is obligated to provide to Buyer the
361 Association Documents, at Seller's expense, on or before **Association Documents Deadline**. Seller authorizes
362 the Association to provide the Association Documents to Buyer, at Seller's expense. Seller's obligation to provide
363 the Association Documents is fulfilled upon Buyer's receipt of the Association Documents, regardless of who
364 provides such documents.

366 **7.4. Conditional on Buyer's Review.** Buyer has the right to review the Association Documents. Buyer
367 has the Right to Terminate under § 25.1, on or before **Association Documents Objection Deadline**, based on
368 any unsatisfactory provision in any of the Association Documents, in Buyer's sole subjective discretion. Should
369 Buyer receive the Association Documents after **Association Documents Deadline**, Buyer, at Buyer's option, has
370 the Right to Terminate under § 25.1 by Buyer's Notice to Terminate received by Seller on or before ten days after
371 Buyer's receipt of the Association Documents. If Buyer does not receive the Association Documents, or if Buyer's
372 Notice to Terminate would otherwise be required to be received by Seller after **Closing Date**, Buyer's Notice to
373 Terminate must be received by Seller on or before Closing. If Seller does not receive Buyer's Notice to Terminate
374 within such time, Buyer accepts the provisions of the Association Documents as satisfactory, and Buyer waives
375 any Right to Terminate under this provision, notwithstanding the provisions of § 8.6 (Right of First Refusal or
376 Contract Approval).

380 **8. TITLE INSURANCE, RECORD TITLE AND OFF-RECORD TITLE.**

381 **8.1. Evidence of Record Title.**

383 **8.1.1. Seller Selects Title Insurance Company.** If this box is checked, Seller will select the title
384 insurance company to furnish the owner's title insurance policy at Seller's expense. On or before **Record Title**
385 **Deadline**, Seller must furnish to Buyer, a current commitment for an owner's title insurance policy (Title
386 Commitment), in an amount equal to the Purchase Price, or if this box is checked, an **Abstract of Title** certified
387 to a current date. Seller will cause the title insurance policy to be issued and delivered to Buyer as soon as
388 practicable at or after Closing.

391 **8.1.2. Buyer Selects Title Insurance Company.** If this box is checked, Buyer will select the title
392 insurance company to furnish the owner's title insurance policy at Buyer's expense. On or before **Record Title**
393 **Deadline**, Buyer must furnish to Seller, a current commitment for owner's title insurance policy (Title Commitment),
394 in an amount equal to the Purchase Price.

396 If neither box in § 8.1.1 or § 8.1.2 is checked, § 8.1.1 applies.

397 **8.1.3. Owner's Extended Coverage (OEC).** The Title Commitment **Will** **Will Not** contain
398 Owner's Extended Coverage (OEC). If the Title Commitment is to contain OEC, it will commit to delete or insure
399 over the standard exceptions which relate to: (1) parties in possession, (2) unrecorded easements, (3) survey
400 matters, (4) unrecorded mechanics' liens, (5) gap period (period between the effective date and time of
401 commitment to the date and time the deed is recorded), and (6) unpaid taxes, assessments and unredeemed tax
402 sales prior to the year of Closing. Any additional premium expense to obtain OEC will be paid by **Buyer**
403 **Seller** **One-Half by Buyer and One-Half by Seller** **Other n/a**.

406 Regardless of whether the Contract requires OEC, the Title Insurance Commitment may not provide OEC or
407 delete or insure over any or all of the standard exceptions for OEC. The Title Insurance Company may require a
408 New Survey or New ILC, defined below, among other requirements for OEC. If the Title Insurance Commitment is
409 not satisfactory to Buyer, Buyer has a right to object under § 8.4 (Right to Object to Title, Resolution).

411 **8.1.4. Title Documents.** Title Documents consist of the following: (1) copies of any plats,
412 declarations, covenants, conditions and restrictions burdening the Property, and (2) copies of any other documents
413 (or, if illegible, summaries of such documents) listed in the schedule of exceptions (Exceptions) in the Title
414 Commitment furnished to Buyer (collectively, Title Documents).

416 **8.1.5. Copies of Title Documents.** Buyer must receive, on or before **Record Title Deadline**,
417 copies of all Title Documents. This requirement pertains only to documents as shown of record in the office of the
418 clerk and recorder in the county where the Property is located. The cost of furnishing copies of the documents
419 required in this Section will be at the expense of the party or parties obligated to pay for the owner's title insurance
420 policy.

422 **8.1.6. Existing Abstracts of Title.** Seller must deliver to Buyer copies of any abstracts of title
423 covering all or any portion of the Property (Abstract of Title) in Seller's possession on or before **Record Title**
424 **Deadline**.

426 **8.2. Record Title.** Buyer has the right to review and object to the Abstract of Title or Title Commitment

427 and any of the Title Documents as set forth in § 8.4 (Right to Object to Title, Resolution) on or before **Record Title**
428 **Objection Deadline**. Buyer's objection may be based on any unsatisfactory form or content of Title Commitment
429 or Abstract of Title, notwithstanding § 13, or any other unsatisfactory title condition, in Buyer's sole subjective
430 discretion. If the Abstract of Title, Title Commitment or Title Documents are not received by Buyer on or before the
431 **Record Title Deadline**, or if there is an endorsement to the Title Commitment that adds a new Exception to title, a
432 copy of the new Exception to title and the modified Title Commitment will be delivered to Buyer. Buyer has until the
433 earlier of Closing or ten days after receipt of such documents by Buyer to review and object to: (1) any required
434 Title Document not timely received by Buyer, (2) any change to the Abstract of Title, Title Commitment or Title
435 Documents, or (3) any endorsement to the Title Commitment. If Seller receives Buyer's Notice to Terminate or
436 Notice of Title Objection, pursuant to this § 8.2 (Record Title), any title objection by Buyer is governed by the
437 provisions set forth in § 8.4 (Right to Object to Title, Resolution). If Seller has fulfilled all Seller's obligations, if any,
438 to deliver to Buyer all documents required by § 8.1 (Evidence of Record Title) and Seller does not receive Buyer's
439 Notice to Terminate or Notice of Title Objection by the applicable deadline specified above, Buyer accepts the
440 condition of title as disclosed by the Abstract of Title, Title Commitment and Title Documents as satisfactory.

441 **8.3. Off-Record Title.** Seller must deliver to Buyer, on or before **Off-Record Title Deadline**, true copies
442 of all existing surveys in Seller's possession pertaining to the Property and must disclose to Buyer all easements,
443 liens (including, without limitation, governmental improvements approved, but not yet installed) or other title
444 matters (including, without limitation, rights of first refusal and options) not shown by public records, of which Seller
445 has actual knowledge (Off-Record Matters). Buyer has the right to inspect the Property to investigate if any third
446 party has any right in the Property not shown by public records (e.g., unrecorded easement, boundary line
447 discrepancy or water rights). Buyer's Notice to Terminate or Notice of Title Objection of any unsatisfactory
448 condition (whether disclosed by Seller or revealed by such inspection, notwithstanding § 8.2 and § 13), in Buyer's
449 sole subjective discretion, must be received by Seller on or before **Off-Record Title Objection Deadline**. If an Off-
450 Record Matter is received by Buyer after the **Off-Record Title Deadline**, Buyer has until the earlier of Closing or
451 ten days after receipt by Buyer to review and object to such Off-Record Matter. If Seller receives Buyer's Notice to
452 Terminate or Notice of Title Objection pursuant to this § 8.3 (Off-Record Title), any title objection by Buyer and this
453 Contract are governed by the provisions set forth in § 8.4 (Right to Object to Title, Resolution). If Seller does not
454 receive Buyer's Notice to Terminate or Notice of Title Objection by the applicable deadline specified above, Buyer
455 accepts title subject to such rights, if any, of third parties of which Buyer has actual knowledge.

456 **8.4. Right to Object to Title, Resolution.** Buyer's right to object to any title matters includes, but is not
457 limited to those matters set forth in §§ 8.2 (Record Title), 8.3 (Off-Record Title) and 13 (Transfer of Title), in Buyer's
458 sole subjective discretion. If Buyer objects to any title matter, on or before the applicable deadline, Buyer has the
459 following options:

460 **8.4.1. Title Objection, Resolution.** If Seller receives Buyer's written notice objecting to any title
461 matter (Notice of Title Objection) on or before the applicable deadline, and if Buyer and Seller have not agreed to a
462 written settlement thereof on or before **Title Resolution Deadline**, this Contract will terminate on the expiration of
463 **Title Resolution Deadline**, unless Seller receives Buyer's written withdrawal of Buyer's Notice of Title Objection
464 (i.e., Buyer's written notice to waive objection to such items and waives the Right to Terminate for that reason), on
465 or before expiration of **Title Resolution Deadline**. If either the Record Title Deadline or the Off-Record Title
466 Deadline, or both, are extended to the earlier of Closing or ten days after receipt of the applicable documents by
467 Buyer, pursuant to § 8.2 (Record Title) or § 8.3 (Off-Record Title), the Title Resolution Deadline also will be
468 automatically extended to the earlier of Closing or fifteen days after Buyer's receipt of the applicable documents; or

469 **8.4.2. Title Objection, Right to Terminate.** Buyer may exercise the Right to Terminate under §
470 25.1, on or before the applicable deadline, based on any unsatisfactory title matter, in Buyer's sole subjective
471 discretion.

472 **8.5. Special Taxing Districts. SPECIAL TAXING DISTRICTS MAY BE SUBJECT TO GENERAL**
473 **OBLIGATION INDEBTEDNESS THAT IS PAID BY REVENUES PRODUCED FROM ANNUAL TAX LEVIES ON**
474 **THE TAXABLE PROPERTY WITHIN SUCH DISTRICTS. PROPERTY OWNERS IN SUCH DISTRICTS MAY BE**
475 **PLACED AT RISK FOR INCREASED MILL LEVIES AND TAX TO SUPPORT THE SERVICING OF SUCH DEBT**
476 **WHERE CIRCUMSTANCES ARISE RESULTING IN THE INABILITY OF SUCH A DISTRICT TO DISCHARGE**
477 **SUCH INDEBTEDNESS WITHOUT SUCH AN INCREASE IN MILL LEVIES. BUYERS SHOULD INVESTIGATE**
478 **THE SPECIAL TAXING DISTRICTS IN WHICH THE PROPERTY IS LOCATED BY CONTACTING THE COUNTY**
479 **TREASURER, BY REVIEWING THE CERTIFICATE OF TAXES DUE FOR THE PROPERTY, AND BY**
480 **OBTAINING FURTHER INFORMATION FROM THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, THE COUNTY**
481 **CLERK AND RECORDER, OR THE COUNTY ASSESSOR.**

482 Buyer has the Right to Terminate under § 25.1, on or before **Off-Record Title Objection Deadline**, based on
483 any unsatisfactory effect of the Property being located within a special taxing district, in Buyer's sole subjective
484 discretion.

498 discretion.

499 **8.6. Right of First Refusal or Contract Approval.** If there is a right of first refusal on the Property or a
500 right to approve this Contract, Seller must promptly submit this Contract according to the terms and conditions of
501 such right. If the holder of the right of first refusal exercises such right or the holder of a right to approve
502 disapproves this Contract, this Contract will terminate. If the right of first refusal is waived explicitly or expires, or
503 the Contract is approved, this Contract will remain in full force and effect. Seller must promptly notify Buyer in
504 writing of the foregoing. If expiration or waiver of the right of first refusal or approval of this Contract has not
505 occurred on or before **Right of First Refusal Deadline**, this Contract will then terminate.
506

507 **8.7. Title Advisory.** The Title Documents affect the title, ownership and use of the Property and should
508 be reviewed carefully. Additionally, other matters not reflected in the Title Documents may affect the title,
509 ownership and use of the Property, including, without limitation, boundary lines and encroachments, set-back
510 requirements, area, zoning, building code violations, unrecorded easements and claims of easements, leases and
511 other unrecorded agreements, water on or under the Property, and various laws and governmental regulations
512 concerning land use, development and environmental matters.
513

514 **8.7.1. OIL, GAS, WATER AND MINERAL DISCLOSURE. THE SURFACE ESTATE OF THE**
515 **PROPERTY MAY BE OWNED SEPARATELY FROM THE UNDERLYING MINERAL ESTATE, AND TRANSFER**
516 **OF THE SURFACE ESTATE MAY NOT NECESSARILY INCLUDE TRANSFER OF THE MINERAL ESTATE OR**
517 **WATER RIGHTS. THIRD PARTIES MAY OWN OR LEASE INTERESTS IN OIL, GAS, OTHER MINERALS,**
518 **GEOTHERMAL ENERGY OR WATER ON OR UNDER THE SURFACE OF THE PROPERTY, WHICH**
519 **INTERESTS MAY GIVE THEM RIGHTS TO ENTER AND USE THE SURFACE OF THE PROPERTY TO**
520 **ACCESS THE MINERAL ESTATE, OIL, GAS OR WATER.**
521

522 **8.7.2. SURFACE USE AGREEMENT. THE USE OF THE SURFACE ESTATE OF THE PROPERTY**
523 **TO ACCESS THE OIL, GAS OR MINERALS MAY BE GOVERNED BY A SURFACE USE AGREEMENT, A**
524 **MEMORANDUM OR OTHER NOTICE OF WHICH MAY BE RECORDED WITH THE COUNTY CLERK AND**
525 **RECORDER.**
526

527 **8.7.3. OIL AND GAS ACTIVITY. OIL AND GAS ACTIVITY THAT MAY OCCUR ON OR**
528 **ADJACENT TO THE PROPERTY MAY INCLUDE, BUT IS NOT LIMITED TO, SURVEYING, DRILLING, WELL**
529 **COMPLETION OPERATIONS, STORAGE, OIL AND GAS, OR PRODUCTION FACILITIES, PRODUCING**
530 **WELLS, REWORKING OF CURRENT WELLS, AND GAS GATHERING AND PROCESSING FACILITIES.**
531

532 **8.7.4. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION. BUYER IS ENCOURAGED TO SEEK ADDITIONAL**
533 **INFORMATION REGARDING OIL AND GAS ACTIVITY ON OR ADJACENT TO THE PROPERTY, INCLUDING**
534 **DRILLING PERMIT APPLICATIONS. THIS INFORMATION MAY BE AVAILABLE FROM THE COLORADO OIL**
535 **AND GAS CONSERVATION COMMISSION.**
536

537 **8.7.5. Title Insurance Exclusions.** Matters set forth in this Section, and others, may be excepted,
538 excluded from, or not covered by the owner's title insurance policy.
539

540 **8.8. Consult an Attorney.** Buyer is advised to timely consult legal counsel with respect to all such matters
541 as there are strict time limits provided in this Contract (e.g., **Record Title Objection Deadline** and **Off-Record**
542 **Title Objection Deadline**).
543

546 **9. NEW ILC, NEW SURVEY.**

547 **9.1. New ILC or New Survey.** If the box is checked, a **New Improvement Location Certificate (New**
548 **ILC)** **New Survey** in the form of n/a is required and the following will apply:
549

550 **9.1.1. Ordering of New ILC or New Survey.** **Seller** **Buyer** will order the New ILC or New
551 Survey. The New ILC or New Survey may also be a previous ILC or survey that is in the above-required form,
552 certified and updated as of a date after the date of this Contract.
553

554 **9.1.2. Payment for New ILC or New Survey.** The cost of the New ILC or New Survey will be paid, on
555 or before Closing, by: **Seller** **Buyer** or: n/a
556

557 **9.1.3. Delivery of New ILC or New Survey.** Buyer, Seller, the issuer of the Title Commitment (or the
558 provider of the opinion of title if an Abstract of Title), and n/a will receive a New ILC or New Survey on or before
559 **New ILC or New Survey Deadline.**
560

561 **9.1.4. Certification of New ILC or New Survey.** The New ILC or New Survey will be certified by the
562 surveyor to all those who are to receive the New ILC or New Survey.
563

564 **9.2. Buyer's Right to Waive or Change New ILC or New Survey Selection.** Buyer may select a New ILC
565 or New Survey different than initially specified in this Contract if there is no additional cost to Seller or change to
566 the **New ILC or New Survey Objection Deadline**. Buyer may, in Buyer's sole subjective discretion, waive a New
567 ILC or New Survey if done prior to Seller incurring any cost for the same.
568

9.3. New ILC or New Survey Objection. Buyer has the right to review and object to the New ILC or New

569 Survey. If the New ILC or New Survey is not timely received by Buyer or is unsatisfactory to Buyer, in Buyer's sole
570 subjective discretion, Buyer may, on or before **New ILC or New Survey Objection Deadline**, notwithstanding §
571 8.3 or § 13:

572 **9.3.1. Notice to Terminate.** Notify Seller in writing that this Contract is terminated; or

573 **9.3.2. New ILC or New Survey Objection.** Deliver to Seller a written description of any matter that was
574 to be shown or is shown in the New ILC or New Survey that is unsatisfactory and that Buyer requires Seller to
575 correct.
576

577 **9.3.3. New ILC or New Survey Resolution.** If a **New ILC or New Survey Objection** is received by
578 Seller, on or before **New ILC or New Survey Objection Deadline**, and if Buyer and Seller have not agreed in
579 writing to a settlement thereof on or before **New ILC or New Survey Resolution Deadline**, this Contract will
580 terminate on expiration of the **New ILC or New Survey Resolution Deadline**, unless Seller receives Buyer's
581 written withdrawal of the New ILC or New Survey Objection before such termination, i.e., on or before expiration of
582 **New ILC or New Survey Resolution Deadline**.
583

586 **DISCLOSURE, INSPECTION AND DUE DILIGENCE**
587

588
589 **10. PROPERTY DISCLOSURE, INSPECTION, INDEMNITY, INSURABILITY AND DUE DILIGENCE.**

590 **10.1. Seller's Property Disclosure.** On or before **Seller's Property Disclosure Deadline**, Seller agrees
591 to deliver to Buyer the most current version of the applicable Colorado Real Estate Commission's Seller's Property
592 Disclosure form completed by Seller to Seller's actual knowledge, current as of the date of this Contract.
593

594 **10.2. Disclosure of Latent Defects; Present Condition.** Seller must disclose to Buyer any latent defects
595 actually known by Seller. Seller agrees that disclosure of latent defects will be in writing. Except as otherwise
596 provided in this Contract, Buyer acknowledges that Seller is conveying the Property to Buyer in an "As Is"
597 condition, "Where Is" and "With All Faults."
598

599 **10.3. Inspection.** Unless otherwise provided in this Contract, Buyer, acting in good faith, has the right to
600 have inspections (by one or more third parties, personally or both) of the Property and Inclusions (Inspection), at
601 Buyer's expense. If (1) the physical condition of the Property, including, but not limited to, the roof, walls, structural
602 integrity of the Property, the electrical, plumbing, HVAC and other mechanical systems of the Property, (2) the
603 physical condition of the Inclusions, (3) service to the Property (including utilities and communication services),
604 systems and components of the Property (e.g., heating and plumbing), (4) any proposed or existing transportation
605 project, road, street or highway, or (5) any other activity, odor or noise (whether on or off the Property) and its
606 effect or expected effect on the Property or its occupants is unsatisfactory, in Buyer's sole subjective discretion,
607 Buyer may, on or before **Inspection Objection Deadline**:
608

609 **10.3.1. Notice to Terminate.** Notify Seller in writing that this Contract is terminated; or

610 **10.3.2. Inspection Objection.** Deliver to Seller a written description of any unsatisfactory physical
611 condition that Buyer requires Seller to correct.
612

613 **10.3.3. Inspection Resolution.** If an Inspection Objection is received by Seller, on or before
614 **Inspection Objection Deadline**, and if Buyer and Seller have not agreed in writing to a settlement thereof on or
615 before **Inspection Resolution Deadline**, this Contract will terminate on **Inspection Resolution Deadline** unless
616 Seller receives Buyer's written withdrawal of the Inspection Objection before such termination, i.e., on or before
617 expiration of **Inspection Resolution Deadline**.
618

619 **10.4. Damage, Liens and Indemnity.** Buyer, except as otherwise provided in this Contract or other
620 written agreement between the parties, is responsible for payment for all inspections, tests, surveys, engineering
621 reports, or other reports performed at Buyer's request (Work) and must pay for any damage that occurs to the
622 Property and Inclusions as a result of such Work. Buyer must not permit claims or liens of any kind against the
623 Property for Work performed on the Property. Buyer agrees to indemnify, protect and hold Seller harmless from
624 and against any liability, damage, cost or expense incurred by Seller and caused by any such Work, claim, or lien.
625 This indemnity includes Seller's right to recover all costs and expenses incurred by Seller to defend against any
626 such liability, damage, cost or expense, or to enforce this section, including Seller's reasonable attorney fees, legal
627 fees and expenses. The provisions of this section survive the termination of this Contract. This § 10.4 does not
628 apply to items performed pursuant to an Inspection Resolution.
629

630 **10.5. Insurability.** Buyer has the right to review and object to the availability, terms and conditions of and
631 premium for property insurance (Property Insurance). Buyer has the Right to Terminate under § 25.1, on or before
632 **Property Insurance Objection Deadline**, based on any unsatisfactory provision of the Property Insurance, in
633 Buyer's sole subjective discretion.
634

635 **10.6. Due Diligence.**

636 **10.6.1. Due Diligence Documents.** If the respective box is checked, Seller agrees to deliver
637

640 copies of the following documents and information pertaining to the Property (Due Diligence Documents) to Buyer
641 on or before **Due Diligence Documents Delivery Deadline**:

- 642 10.6.1.1. All contracts relating to the operation, maintenance and management of the
643 Property;
644 10.6.1.2. Property tax bills for the last 3 years;
645 10.6.1.3. As-built construction plans to the Property and the tenant improvements,
646 including architectural, electrical, mechanical, and structural systems, engineering reports, and permanent
647 Certificates of Occupancy, to the extent now available;
648 10.6.1.4. A list of all Inclusions to be conveyed to Buyer;
649 10.6.1.5. Operating statements for the past 3 years;
650 10.6.1.6. A rent roll accurate and correct to the date of this Contract;
651 10.6.1.7. All current leases, including any amendments or other occupancy agreements,
652 pertaining to the Property. Those leases or other occupancy agreements pertaining to the Property that survive
653 Closing are as follows (Leases): Timbers` lease
654 10.6.1.8. A schedule of any tenant improvement work Seller is obligated to complete but
655 has not yet been completed and capital improvement work either scheduled or in process on the date of this
656 Contract;
657 10.6.1.9. All insurance policies pertaining to the Property and copies of any claims which
658 have been made for the past 3 years;
659 10.6.1.10. Soils reports, surveys and engineering reports or data pertaining to the Property
660 (if not delivered earlier under § 8.3);
661 10.6.1.11. Any and all existing documentation and reports regarding Phase I and II
662 environmental reports, letters, test results, advisories, and similar documents respective to the existence or
663 nonexistence of asbestos, PCB transformers, or other toxic, hazardous or contaminated substances, and/or
664 underground storage tanks and/or radon gas. If no reports are in Seller's possession or known to Seller, Seller
665 warrants that no such reports are in Seller's possession or known to Seller;
666 10.6.1.12. Any *Americans with Disabilities Act* reports, studies or surveys concerning the
667 compliance of the Property with said Act;
668 10.6.1.13. All permits, licenses and other building or use authorizations issued by any
669 governmental authority with jurisdiction over the Property and written notice of any violation of any such permits,
670 licenses or use authorizations, if any; and
671 10.6.1.14. Other documents and information:
672 Condo plat and/or plans for the building

684 **10.6.2. Due Diligence Documents Review and Objection.** Buyer has the right to review and
685 object to Due Diligence Documents. If the Due Diligence Documents are not supplied to Buyer or are
686 unsatisfactory in Buyer's sole subjective discretion, Buyer may, on or before **Due Diligence Documents**
687 **Objection Deadline**:

688 **10.6.2.1. Notice to Terminate.** Notify Seller in writing that this Contract is terminated; or

689 **10.6.2.2. Due Diligence Documents Objection.** Deliver to Seller a written description of
690 any unsatisfactory Due Diligence Documents that Buyer requires Seller to correct.

691 **10.6.2.3. Due Diligence Documents Resolution.** If a Due Diligence Documents Objection
692 is received by Seller, on or before **Due Diligence Documents Objection Deadline**, and if Buyer and Seller have
693 not agreed in writing to a settlement thereof on or before **Due Diligence Documents Resolution Deadline**, this
694 Contract will terminate on **Due Diligence Documents Resolution Deadline** unless Seller receives Buyer's written
695 withdrawal of the Due Diligence Documents Objection before such termination, i.e., on or before expiration of **Due**
696 **Diligence Documents Resolution Deadline**.

697 **10.6.3. Zoning.** Buyer has the Right to Terminate under § 25.1, on or before **Due Diligence**
698 **Documents Objection Deadline**, based on any unsatisfactory zoning and any use restrictions imposed by any
699 governmental agency with jurisdiction over the Property, in Buyer's sole subjective discretion.

700 **10.6.4. Due Diligence – Environmental, ADA.** Buyer has the right to obtain environmental
701 inspections of the Property including Phase I and Phase II Environmental Site Assessments, as applicable.
702 Seller Buyer will order or provide **Phase I Environmental Site Assessment, Phase II Environmental Site**
703 **Assessment** (compliant with most current version of the applicable ASTM E1527 standard practices for
704 Environmental Site Assessments) and/or n/a, at the expense of Seller Buyer (Environmental Inspection). In
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711 addition, Buyer, at Buyer's expense, may also conduct an evaluation whether the Property complies with the
712 *Americans with Disabilities Act* (ADA Evaluation). All such inspections and evaluations must be conducted at such
713 times as are mutually agreeable to minimize the interruption of Seller's and any Seller's tenants' business uses of
714 the Property, if any.
715

716 If Buyer's Phase I Environmental Site Assessment recommends a Phase II Environmental Site
717 Assessment, the **Environmental Inspection Objection Deadline** will be extended by days (Extended
718 Environmental Inspection Objection Deadline) and if such Extended Environmental Inspection Objection Deadline
719 extends beyond the **Closing Date**, the **Closing Date** will be extended a like period of time. In such event, Seller
720 Buyer must pay the cost for such Phase II Environmental Site Assessment.
721

722 Notwithstanding Buyer's right to obtain additional environmental inspections of the Property in this § 10.6.5,
723 Buyer has the Right to Terminate under § 25.1, on or before **Environmental Inspection Objection Deadline**, or if
724 applicable, the Extended Environmental Inspection Objection Deadline, based on any unsatisfactory results of
725 Environmental Inspection, in Buyer's sole subjective discretion.
726

727 Buyer has the Right to Terminate under § 25.1, on or before **ADA Evaluation Objection Deadline**, based
728 on any unsatisfactory ADA Evaluation, in Buyer's sole subjective discretion.
729

730 **10.7. Conditional Upon Sale of Property.** This Contract is conditional upon the sale and closing of that
731 certain property owned by Buyer and commonly known as see Section 30, additional provisions. Buyer has
732 the Right to Terminate under § 25.1 effective upon Seller's receipt of Buyer's Notice to Terminate on or before
733 **Conditional Sale Deadline** if such property is not sold and closed by such deadline. This § 10.7 is for the sole
734 benefit of Buyer. If Seller does not receive Buyer's Notice to Terminate on or before **Conditional Sale Deadline**,
735 Buyer waives any Right to Terminate under this provision.
736

737 **10.8. Existing Leases; Modification of Existing Leases; New Leases.** Seller states that none of the
738 Leases to be assigned to the Buyer at the time of Closing contain any rent concessions, rent reductions or rent
739 abatements except as disclosed in the Lease or other writing received by Buyer. Seller will not amend, alter,
740 modify, extend or cancel any of the Leases nor will Seller enter into any new leases affecting the Property without
741 the prior written consent of Buyer, which consent will not be unreasonably withheld or delayed.
742

744 **11. TENANT ESTOPPEL STATEMENTS.**

745 **11.1. Tenant Estoppel Statements Conditions.** Buyer has the right to review and object to any
746 Estoppel Statements. Seller must obtain and deliver to Buyer on or before **Tenant Estoppel Statements**
747 **Deadline**, statements in a form and substance reasonably acceptable to Buyer, from each occupant or tenant at
748 the Property (Estoppel Statement) attached to a copy of the Lease stating:
749

750 **11.1.1.** The commencement date of the Lease and scheduled termination date of the Lease;

751 **11.1.2.** That said Lease is in full force and effect and that there have been no subsequent
752 modifications or amendments;

753 **11.1.3.** The amount of any advance rentals paid, rent concessions given, and deposits paid to
754 Seller;

755 **11.1.4.** The amount of monthly (or other applicable period) rental paid to Seller;

756 **11.1.5.** That there is no default under the terms of said Lease by landlord or occupant; and

757 **11.1.6.** That the Lease to which the Estoppel is attached is a true, correct and complete copy of
758 the Lease demising the premises it describes.
759

760 **11.2. Tenant Estoppel Statements Objection.** Buyer has the Right to Terminate under § 25.1, on or
761 before **Tenant Estoppel Statements Objection Deadline**, based on any unsatisfactory Estoppel Statement, in
762 Buyer's sole subjective discretion, or if Seller fails to deliver the Estoppel Statements on or before **Tenant**
763 **Estoppel Statements Deadline**. Buyer also has the unilateral right to waive any unsatisfactory Estoppel
764 Statement.
765
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767

768 **CLOSING PROVISIONS**

769 **12. CLOSING DOCUMENTS, INSTRUCTIONS AND CLOSING.**

770 **12.1. Closing Documents and Closing Information.** Seller and Buyer will cooperate with the Closing
771 Company to enable the Closing Company to prepare and deliver documents required for Closing to Buyer and
772 Seller and their designees. If Buyer is obtaining a new loan to purchase the Property, Buyer acknowledges Buyer's
773 lender is required to provide the Closing Company, in a timely manner, all required loan documents and financial
774 information concerning Buyer's new loan. Buyer and Seller will furnish any additional information and documents
775 required by Closing Company that will be necessary to complete this transaction. Buyer and Seller will sign and
776 complete all customary or reasonably required documents at or before Closing.
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12.2. Closing Instructions. Colorado Real Estate Commission's Closing Instructions Are Are Not executed with this Contract.

12.3. Closing. Delivery of deed from Seller to Buyer will be at closing (Closing). Closing will be on the date specified as the **Closing Date** or by mutual agreement at an earlier date. The hour and place of Closing will be as designated by **Title Company**.

12.4. Disclosure of Settlement Costs. Buyer and Seller acknowledge that costs, quality, and extent of service vary between different settlement service providers (e.g., attorneys, lenders, inspectors and title companies).

13. TRANSFER OF TITLE. Subject to tender of payment at Closing as required herein and compliance by Buyer with the other terms and provisions hereof, Seller must execute and deliver a good and sufficient **special warranty deed** to Buyer, at Closing, conveying the Property free and clear of all taxes except the general taxes for the year of Closing. Except as provided herein, title will be conveyed free and clear of all liens, including any governmental liens for special improvements installed as of the date of Buyer's signature hereon, whether assessed or not. Title will be conveyed subject to:

13.1. Those specific Exceptions described by reference to recorded documents as reflected in the Title Documents accepted by Buyer in accordance with **Record Title**,

13.2. Distribution utility easements (including cable TV),

13.3. Those specifically described rights of third parties not shown by the public records of which Buyer has actual knowledge and which were accepted by Buyer in accordance with **Off-Record Title** and **New ILC or New Survey**,

13.4. Inclusion of the Property within any special taxing district, and

13.5. Any special assessment if the improvements were not installed as of the date of Buyer's signature hereon, whether assessed prior to or after Closing, and

13.6. Other n/a.

14. PAYMENT OF ENCUMBRANCES. Any encumbrance required to be paid will be paid at or before Closing from the proceeds of this transaction or from any other source.

15. CLOSING COSTS, CLOSING FEE, ASSOCIATION FEES AND TAXES.

15.1. Closing Costs. Buyer and Seller must pay, in Good Funds, their respective closing costs and all other items required to be paid at Closing, except as otherwise provided herein.

15.2. Closing Services Fee. The fee for real estate closing services must be paid at Closing by Buyer Seller

One-Half by Buyer and One-Half by Seller

Other n/a.

15.3. Status Letter and Record Change Fees. Any fees incident to the issuance of Association's statement of assessments (Status Letter) must be paid by None Buyer Seller One-Half by Buyer and One-Half by Seller. Any record change fee assessed by the Association including, but not limited to, ownership record transfer fees regardless of name or title of such fee (Association's Record Change Fee) must be paid by None Buyer Seller One-Half by Buyer and One-Half by Seller.

15.4. Local Transfer Tax. The Local Transfer Tax of n/a % of the Purchase Price must be paid at Closing by None Buyer Seller One-Half by Buyer and One-Half by Seller.

15.5. Private Transfer Fee. Private transfer fees and other fees due to a transfer of the Property, payable at Closing, such as community association fees, developer fees and foundation fees, must be paid at Closing by None Buyer Seller One-Half by Buyer and One-Half by Seller. The Private Transfer fee, whether one or more, is for the following association(s): n/a in the total amount of % of the Purchase Price or \$.

15.6. Water Transfer Fees. The Water Transfer Fees can change. The fees, as of the date of this Contract, do not exceed \$ n/a for:

15.7. Sales and Use Tax. Any sales and use tax that may accrue because of this transaction must be paid when due by None Buyer Seller One-Half by Buyer and One-Half by Seller.

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16. PRORATIONS. The following will be prorated to the **Closing Date**, except as otherwise provided:

16.1. Taxes. Personal property taxes, if any, special taxing district assessments, if any, and general real estate taxes for the year of Closing, based on **Taxes for the Calendar Year Immediately Preceding Closing** **Most Recent Mill Levy and Most Recent Assessed Valuation**, adjusted by any applicable qualifying seniors property tax exemption, qualifying disabled veteran exemption or **Other n/a**.

16.2. Rents. Rents based on **Rents Actually Received** **Accrued**. At Closing, Seller will transfer or credit to Buyer the security deposits for all Leases assigned, or any remainder after lawful deductions, and notify all tenants in writing of such transfer and of the transferee's name and address. Seller must assign to Buyer all Leases in effect at Closing and Buyer must assume Seller's obligations under such Leases.

16.3. Association Assessments. Current regular Association assessments and dues (Association Assessments) paid in advance will be credited to Seller at Closing. Cash reserves held out of the regular Association Assessments for deferred maintenance by the Association will not be credited to Seller except as may be otherwise provided by the Governing Documents. Buyer acknowledges that Buyer may be obligated to pay the Association, at Closing, an amount for reserves or working capital. Any special assessment assessed prior to **Closing Date** by the Association will be the obligation of **Buyer** **Seller**. Except however, any special assessment by the Association for improvements that have been installed as of the date of Buyer's signature hereon, whether assessed prior to or after Closing, will be the obligation of Seller. Seller represents that the Association Assessments are currently payable at approximately \$ n/a per n/a and that there are no unpaid regular or special assessments against the Property except the current regular assessments and *none*. Such assessments are subject to change as provided in the Governing Documents. Seller agrees to promptly request the Association to deliver to Buyer before **Closing Date** a current Status Letter.

16.4. Other Prorations. Water and sewer charges, propane, interest on continuing loan, and *none*.

16.5. Final Settlement. Unless otherwise agreed in writing, these prorations are final.

17. POSSESSION. Possession of the Property will be delivered to Buyer on **Possession Date** at **Possession Time**, subject to the Leases as set forth in § 10.6.1.7.

If Seller, after Closing, fails to deliver possession as specified, Seller will be subject to eviction and will be additionally liable to Buyer for payment of \$ 350 per day (or any part of a day notwithstanding § 18.1) from **Possession Date** and **Possession Time** until possession is delivered.

GENERAL PROVISIONS

18. DAY; COMPUTATION OF PERIOD OF DAYS, DEADLINE.

18.1. Day. As used in this Contract, the term "day" means the entire day ending at 11:59 p.m., United States Mountain Time (Standard or Daylight Savings as applicable).

18.2. Computation of Period of Days, Deadline. In computing a period of days, when the ending date is not specified, the first day is excluded and the last day is included (e.g., three days after MEC). If any deadline falls on a Saturday, Sunday or federal or Colorado state holiday (Holiday), such deadline **Will** **Will Not** be extended to the next day that is not a Saturday, Sunday or Holiday. Should neither box be checked, the deadline will not be extended.

19. CAUSES OF LOSS, INSURANCE; DAMAGE TO INCLUSIONS AND SERVICES; CONDEMNATION; AND WALK-THROUGH. Except as otherwise provided in this Contract, the Property, Inclusions or both will be delivered in the condition existing as of the date of this Contract, ordinary wear and tear excepted.

19.1. Causes of Loss, Insurance. In the event the Property or Inclusions are damaged by fire, other perils or causes of loss prior to Closing in an amount of not more than ten percent of the total Purchase Price (Property Damage), and if the repair of the damage will be paid by insurance (other than the deductible to be paid by Seller), then Seller, upon receipt of the insurance proceeds, will use Seller's reasonable efforts to repair the Property before **Closing Date**. Buyer has the Right to Terminate under § 25.1, on or before **Closing Date** if the Property is not repaired before **Closing Date** or if the damage exceeds such sum. Should Buyer elect to carry out this Contract despite such Property Damage, Buyer is entitled to a credit at Closing for all insurance proceeds that were received by Seller (but not the Association, if any) resulting from damage to the Property and Inclusions, plus the amount of any deductible provided for in the insurance policy. This credit may not exceed the Purchase Price. In the event Seller has not received the insurance proceeds prior to Closing, the parties may agree to extend the **Closing Date** to have the Property repaired prior to Closing or, at the option of Buyer, (1) Seller must assign to

924 Buyer the right to the proceeds at Closing, if acceptable to Seller's insurance company and Buyer's lender; or (2)
925 the parties may enter into a written agreement prepared by the parties or their attorney requiring the Seller to
926 escrow at Closing from Seller's sale proceeds the amount Seller has received and will receive due to such
927 damage, not exceeding the total Purchase Price, plus the amount of any deductible that applies to the insurance
928 claim.
929

930 **19.2. Damage, Inclusions and Services.** Should any Inclusion or service (including utilities and
931 communication services), system, component or fixture of the Property (collectively Service) (e.g., heating or
932 plumbing), fail or be damaged between the date of this Contract and Closing or possession, whichever is earlier,
933 then Seller is liable for the repair or replacement of such Inclusion or Service with a unit of similar size, age and
934 quality, or an equivalent credit, but only to the extent that the maintenance or replacement of such Inclusion or
935 Service is not the responsibility of the Association, if any, less any insurance proceeds received by Buyer covering
936 such repair or replacement. If the failed or damaged Inclusion or Service is not repaired or replaced on or before
937 Closing or possession, whichever is earlier, Buyer has the Right to Terminate under § 25.1, on or before **Closing**
938 **Date**, or, at the option of Buyer, Buyer is entitled to a credit at Closing for the repair or replacement of such
939 Inclusion or Service. Such credit must not exceed the Purchase Price. If Buyer receives such a credit, Seller's right
940 for any claim against the Association, if any, will survive Closing. Seller and Buyer are aware of the existence of
941 pre-owned home warranty programs that may be purchased and may cover the repair or replacement of such
942 Inclusions.
943

944 **19.3. Condemnation.** In the event Seller receives actual notice prior to Closing that a pending
945 condemnation action may result in a taking of all or part of the Property or Inclusions, Seller must promptly notify
946 Buyer, in writing, of such condemnation action. Buyer has the Right to Terminate under § 25.1, on or before
947 **Closing Date**, based on such condemnation action, in Buyer's sole subjective discretion. Should Buyer elect to
948 consummate this Contract despite such diminution of value to the Property and Inclusions, Buyer is entitled to a
949 credit at Closing for all condemnation proceeds awarded to Seller for the diminution in the value of the Property or
950 Inclusions but such credit will not include relocation benefits or expenses, or exceed the Purchase Price.
951

952 **19.4. Walk-Through and Verification of Condition.** Buyer, upon reasonable notice, has the right to
953 walk through the Property prior to Closing to verify that the physical condition of the Property and Inclusions
954 complies with this Contract.
955

956 **20. RECOMMENDATION OF LEGAL AND TAX COUNSEL.** By signing this Contract, Buyer and Seller
957 acknowledge that the respective broker has advised that this Contract has important legal consequences and has
958 recommended the examination of title and consultation with legal and tax or other counsel before signing this
959 Contract.
960

961 **21. TIME OF ESSENCE, DEFAULT AND REMEDIES.** Time is of the essence for all dates and deadlines in
962 this Contract. This means that all dates and deadlines are strict and absolute. If any payment due, including
963 Earnest Money, is not paid, honored or tendered when due, or if any obligation is not performed timely as provided
964 in this Contract or waived, the non-defaulting party has the following remedies:
965

966 **21.1. If Buyer is in Default:**

967 **21.1.1. Specific Performance.** Seller may elect to cancel this Contract and all Earnest Money
968 (whether or not paid by Buyer) will be paid to Seller and retained by Seller. It is agreed that the Earnest Money is
969 not a penalty, and the Parties agree the amount is fair and reasonable. Seller may recover such additional
970 damages as may be proper. Alternatively, Seller may elect to treat this Contract as being in full force and effect
971 and Seller has the right to specific performance or damages, or both.
972

973 **21.1.2. Liquidated Damages, Applicable.** This § 21.1.2 applies unless the box in § 21.1.1. is
974 **checked.** Seller may cancel this Contract. All Earnest Money (whether or not paid by Buyer) will be paid to Seller,
975 and retained by Seller. It is agreed that the Earnest Money specified in § 4.1 is LIQUIDATED DAMAGES, and not
976 a penalty, which amount the parties agree is fair and reasonable and (except as provided in §§ 10.4, 22, 23 and
977 24), said payment of Earnest Money is SELLER'S ONLY REMEDY for Buyer's failure to perform the obligations of
978 this Contract. Seller expressly waives the remedies of specific performance and additional damages.
979

980 **21.2. If Seller is in Default:** Buyer may elect to treat this Contract as canceled, in which case all Earnest
981 Money received hereunder will be returned and Buyer may recover such damages as may be proper. Alternatively,
982 Buyer may elect to treat this Contract as being in full force and effect and Buyer has the right to specific
983 performance or damages, or both.
984

985 **22. LEGAL FEES, COST AND EXPENSES.** Anything to the contrary herein notwithstanding, in the event of
986 any arbitration or litigation relating to this Contract, prior to or after **Closing Date**, the arbitrator or court must
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995 award to the prevailing party all reasonable costs and expenses, including attorney fees, legal fees and expenses.
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997 **23. MEDIATION.** If a dispute arises relating to this Contract, (whether prior to or after Closing) and is not
998 resolved, the parties must first proceed, in good faith, to mediation. Mediation is a process in which the parties
999 meet with an impartial person who helps to resolve the dispute informally and confidentially. Mediators cannot
1000 impose binding decisions. Before any mediated settlement is binding, the parties to the dispute must agree to the
1001 settlement, in writing. The parties will jointly appoint an acceptable mediator and will share equally in the cost of
1002 such mediation. The obligation to mediate, unless otherwise agreed, will terminate if the entire dispute is not
1003 resolved within thirty days of the date written notice requesting mediation is delivered by one party to the other at
1004 that party's last known address (physical or electronic as provided in § 27). Nothing in this Section prohibits either
1005 party from filing a lawsuit and recording a *lis pendens* affecting the Property, before or after the date of written
1006 notice requesting mediation. This section will not alter any date in this Contract, unless otherwise agreed.
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1011 **24. EARNEST MONEY DISPUTE.** Except as otherwise provided herein, Earnest Money Holder must release
1012 the Earnest Money following receipt of written mutual instructions, signed by both Buyer and Seller. In the event of
1013 any controversy regarding the Earnest Money, Earnest Money Holder is not required to release the Earnest
1014 Money. Earnest Money Holder, in its sole subjective discretion, has several options: (1) wait for any proceeding
1015 between Buyer and Seller; (2) interplead all parties and deposit Earnest Money into a court of competent
1016 jurisdiction, (Earnest Money Holder is entitled to recover court costs and reasonable attorney and legal fees
1017 incurred with such action); or (3) provide notice to Buyer and Seller that unless Earnest Money Holder receives a
1018 copy of the Summons and Complaint or Claim (between Buyer and Seller) containing the case number of the
1019 lawsuit (Lawsuit) within one hundred twenty days of Earnest Money Holder's notice to the parties, Earnest Money
1020 Holder is authorized to return the Earnest Money to Buyer. In the event Earnest Money Holder does receive a copy
1021 of the Lawsuit, and has not interpleaded the monies at the time of any Order, Earnest Money Holder must disburse the
1022 Earnest Money pursuant to the Order of the Court. The parties reaffirm the obligation of **Mediation**. This Section
1023 will survive cancellation or termination of this Contract.
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1028 **25. TERMINATION.**

1029 **25.1. Right to Terminate.** If a party has a right to terminate, as provided in this Contract (Right to
1030 Terminate), the termination is effective upon the other party's receipt of a written notice to terminate (Notice to
1031 Terminate), provided such written notice was received on or before the applicable deadline specified in this
1032 Contract. If the Notice to Terminate is not received on or before the specified deadline, the party with the Right to
1033 Terminate accepts the specified matter, document or condition as satisfactory and waives the Right to Terminate
1034 under such provision.
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1037 **25.2. Effect of Termination.** In the event this Contract is terminated, all Earnest Money received
1038 hereunder will be returned and the parties are relieved of all obligations hereunder, subject to §§ 10.4, 22, 23 and
1039 24.
1040
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1042 **26. ENTIRE AGREEMENT, MODIFICATION, SURVIVAL; SUCCESSORS.** This Contract, its exhibits and
1043 specified addenda, constitute the entire agreement between the parties relating to the subject hereof, and any
1044 prior agreements pertaining thereto, whether oral or written, have been merged and integrated into this Contract.
1045 No subsequent modification of any of the terms of this Contract is valid, binding upon the parties, or enforceable
1046 unless made in writing and signed by the parties. Any right or obligation in this Contract that, by its terms, exists or
1047 is intended to be performed after termination or Closing survives the same. Any successor to a Party receives the
1048 predecessor's benefits and obligations of this Contract.
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1051 **27. NOTICE, DELIVERY, AND CHOICE OF LAW.**

1052 **27.1. Physical Delivery and Notice.** Any document, or notice to Buyer or Seller must be in writing, except
1053 as provided in § 27.2, and is effective when physically received by such party, any individual named in this
1054 Contract to receive documents or notices for such party, the Broker, or Brokerage Firm of Broker working with such
1055 party (except any notice or delivery after Closing must be received by the party, not Broker or Brokerage Firm).
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1058 **27.2. Electronic Notice.** As an alternative to physical delivery, any notice, may be delivered in electronic
1059 form to Buyer or Seller, any individual named in this Contract to receive documents or notices for such party, the
1060 Broker or Brokerage Firm of Broker working with such party (except any notice or delivery after Closing must be
1061 received by the party; not Broker or Brokerage Firm) at the electronic address of the recipient by facsimile, email or
1062 internet.
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1064 **27.3. Electronic Delivery.** Electronic Delivery of documents and notice may be delivered by: (1) email at
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1066 the email address of the recipient, (2) a link or access to a website or server provided the recipient receives the
1067 information necessary to access the documents, or (3) facsimile at the Fax No. of the recipient.

1068 **27.4. Choice of Law.** This Contract and all disputes arising hereunder are governed by and construed in
1069 accordance with the laws of the State of Colorado that would be applicable to Colorado residents who sign a
1070 contract in Colorado for real property located in Colorado.
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1073 **28. NOTICE OF ACCEPTANCE, COUNTERPARTS.** This proposal will expire unless accepted in writing, by
1074 Buyer and Seller, as evidenced by their signatures below, and the offering party receives notice of such
1075 acceptance pursuant to § 27 on or before **Acceptance Deadline Date** and **Acceptance Deadline Time**. If
1076 accepted, this document will become a contract between Seller and Buyer. A copy of this Contract may be
1077 executed by each party, separately, and when each party has executed a copy thereof, such copies taken together

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



If neither party provides the other party with a notice to terminate by the Sale Order Approval Deadline, the Sale Order will be deemed approved by both parties. Closing shall occur within five (5) days after the Sale Order becomes final and non-appealable.

§30.5. Buyer's Remedies. Paragraph 21.2 shall be deleted and replaced with the following: 21.2. If Seller is in Default: Buyer may elect to treat this Contract as canceled, in which case all Earnest Money received hereunder will be returned. Said payment of Earnest Money is Buyer's Only Remedy for Seller's failure to perform the obligations of this Contract. Buyer expressly waives all additional remedies, including the remedies of specific performance and additional damages.

§30.6. Property and Inclusions Sold "As Is." Buyer is hereby notified that the property is being sold "As Is" and "With All Faults" based upon Buyer's own investigation(s). Seller shall neither undertake any repairs to the property nor make any financial concessions in consideration of any objections Buyer may have to the physical condition of the property. This provision does not limit Buyer's rights under Paragraph 10 of the Contract.

§30.7. Property Disclosures; Reliance. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the Contract, Buyer acknowledges and agrees that Seller will not provide and is under no obligation or duty to provide any information or disclosures regarding the Property. If any information is provided by Seller ("Information"), then it is provided by Seller to Buyer "as-is", without recourse, and with no representations or warranties of any kind, including without limitation as to the accuracy or completeness of such documents or information. Buyer cannot rely on the Information unless Buyer obtains, at Buyer's expense, reliance letters from any third-party preparers of such information. Not in limitation of the foregoing, Buyer acknowledges and agrees that Seller shall have no liability, and is hereby released from all liability, to Buyer and any third party, with respect to the Information, including without limitation any liability for misrepresentations, misstatements, mistakes, errors, or other inaccuracies contained in any Information. This Paragraph shall survive Closing and any termination of this Contract, any other provision hereof to the contrary notwithstanding.

§30.8. Buyer's Diligence. Buyer warrants and represents to Seller that Buyer is relying solely on Buyer's own investigation of the Property and Inclusions and not on any information provided or to be provided by Seller; Buyer will review and investigate the property and any improvements on it and Inclusions as Buyer deems necessary and appropriate and will consult such records, outside resources, consultants and engineers as Buyer deems appropriate; and Buyer's decision to purchase the Property and Inclusions will be based solely on that review, investigation, and consultation. If Buyer acquires the Property and Inclusions, Buyer will be doing so in its then present condition.


§30.9. Buyer's Confirmation of Completed Diligence. Within 3 days after the expiration of the final objection and/or resolution deadline, or earlier in Buyer's discretion, Buyer shall confirm in writing that all contingencies have expired by providing the following notice to Seller in writing: "Buyer has conducted its due diligence of all aspects of the Property and Inclusions and is satisfied with the condition of the same in all respects, and hereby expressly waives any right Buyer currently has, or in the future may have, to object under any objection deadline or other contingency under the Contract, including pursuant to Paragraphs 5.2, 5.4, 6.2, 7.4, 8.2, 8.3, 8.4, 9.3, 10.3, 10.5, or 10.6, or any other Right to Terminate contained within the Contract, except for Buyer's Right to Terminate pursuant to Additional Provisions, Paragraphs 30.3 and 30.4 related to the Bankruptcy Court's approval of Sale Order. Buyer's Earnest Money is nonrefundable in all other respects. All other terms of the Contract

are hereby ratified." Seller has no obligation to file a motion for the Sale Order until Buyer has delivered this confirmation to Seller.

§30.10. Attorney Review. This Contract is contingent upon the satisfactory review of the Contract by the Buyer's and Seller's respective attorneys within five (5) business days of MEC. In the event any of the legal provisions of the Contract are deemed unsatisfactory by either attorney, such attorney shall provide the other party with written notice of the unsatisfactory provision within a five (5) business days of MEC. If neither party provides such written notice within such period, this contingency shall be deemed satisfied. If written notice of an unsatisfactory provision is provided within such period, and the Buyer and Seller have not executed an amendment to the Contract in mutual resolution of the unsatisfactory provision within seven (7) business days of complete execution of this Contract, then this Contract shall be deemed terminated. Upon termination, all earnest monies shall be returned to Buyer and both parties shall be relieved of all further obligations hereunder.



 signing a Sale contract, Seller is responsible for payment of same, unless otherwise agreed.

- 280 **15. EVIDENCE OF TITLE.** Seller agrees to furnish buyer, at Seller's expense, unless the parties agree in writing to a
 281 different arrangement, a current commitment and an owner's title insurance policy in an amount equal to the Purchase
 282 Price as specified in the Sale contract, or if this box is checked, **An Abstract of Title** certified to a current date.
- 283 **16. ASSOCIATION ASSESSMENTS.** Seller represents that the amount of the regular owners' association
 284 assessment is currently payable at approximately \$ _____ per _____ and that there are no unpaid
 285 regular or special assessments against the Property except the current regular assessments and except _____
 286 _____. Seller agrees to promptly request the owners' association to deliver to buyer before
 287 date of closing a current statement of assessments against the Property.
- 288 **17. POSSESSION.** Possession of the Property will be delivered to buyer as follows: **Date of Delivery of Deed** _____

- 290 **18. MATERIAL DEFECTS, DISCLOSURES AND INSPECTION.**
- 291 **18.1. Broker's Obligations.** Colorado law requires a broker to disclose to any prospective buyer all adverse
 292 material facts actually known by such broker including but not limited to adverse material facts pertaining to the
 293 title to the Property and the physical condition of the Property, any material defects in the Property, and any
 294 environmental hazards affecting the Property which are required by law to be disclosed. These types of
 295 disclosures may include such matters as structural defects, soil conditions, violations of health, zoning or building
 296 laws, and nonconforming uses and zoning variances. Seller agrees that any buyer may have the Property and
 297 Inclusions inspected and authorizes Broker to disclose any facts actually known by Broker about the Property.
- 298 **18.2. Seller's Obligations.**
- 299 **18.2.1. Seller's Property Disclosure Form.** Disclosure of known material latent (not obvious) defects is

 301 completed to Seller's current, actual knowledge.
- 302 **18.2.2. Lead-Based Paint.** Unless exempt, if the improvements on the Property include one or more
 303 residential dwellings for which a building permit was issued prior to January 1, 1978, a completed Lead-Based
 304 Paint Disclosure (Sales) form must be signed by Seller and the real estate licensees, and given to any
 305 potential buyer in a timely manner.
- 306 **18.2.3. Carbon Monoxide Alarms.** Note: If the improvements on the Property have a fuel-fired heater or
 307 appliance, a fireplace, or an attached garage and one or more rooms lawfully used for sleeping purposes
 308 (Bedroom), Seller understands that Colorado law requires that Seller assure the Property has an operational
 309 carbon monoxide alarm installed within fifteen feet of the entrance to each Bedroom or in a location as
 310 required by the applicable building code, prior to offering the Property for sale or lease.
- 311 **18.2.4. Condition of Property.** The Property will be conveyed in the condition existing as of the date of the
 312 sales contract or lease, ordinary wear and tear excepted, unless Seller, at Seller's sole option, agrees in
 313 writing to any repairs or other work to be performed by Seller.
- 314 **19. RIGHT OF PARTIES TO CANCEL.**
- 315 **19.1. Right of Seller to Cancel.** In the event Broker defaults under this Seller Listing Contract, Seller has the
 316 right to cancel this Seller Listing Contract, including all rights of Brokerage Firm to any compensation if the Seller
 317 Agency box is checked. Examples of a Broker default include, but are not limited to (1) abandonment of Seller, (2)
 318 failure to fulfill all material obligations of Broker and (3) failure to fulfill all material Uniform Duties (§ 5) or, if the
 319 Seller Agency box at the top of page 1 is checked, the failure to fulfill all material Additional Duties Of Seller's
 320 Agent (§ 6). Any rights of Seller that accrued prior to cancellation will survive such cancellation.
- 321 **19.2. Right of Broker to Cancel.** Brokerage Firm may cancel this Seller Listing Contract upon written notice to
 322 Seller that title is not satisfactory to Brokerage Firm. Although Broker has no obligation to investigate or inspect
 323 the Property, and no duty to verify statements made, Brokerage Firm has the right to cancel this Seller Listing
 324 Contract if any of the following are unsatisfactory (1) the physical condition of the Property or Inclusions, (2) any
 325 proposed or existing transportation project, road, street or highway, (3) any other activity, odor or noise (whether
 326 on or off the Property) and its effect or expected effect on the Property or its occupants, or (4) any facts or
 327 suspicions regarding circumstances that could psychologically impact or stigmatize the Property. Additionally,
 328 Brokerage Firm has the right to cancel this Seller Listing Contract if Seller or occupant of the Property fails to

 339 brokerage firms, if any. Neither Broker nor Brokerage Firm will obtain or order any other products or services unless
 340 Seller agrees in writing to pay for them promptly when due (examples: surveys, radon tests, soil tests, title reports,
 341 engineering studies, property inspections). Unless otherwise agreed, neither Broker nor Brokerage Firm is obligated
 342 to advance funds for Seller. Seller must reimburse Brokerage Firm for payments made by Brokerage Firm for such
 343 products or services authorized by Seller.

344 **22. DISCLOSURE OF SETTLEMENT COSTS.** Seller acknowledges that costs, quality, and extent of service vary
 345 between different settlement service providers (e.g., attorneys, lenders, inspectors and title companies).

346 **23. MAINTENANCE OF THE PROPERTY.** Neither Broker nor Brokerage Firm is responsible for maintenance of the
 347 Property nor are they liable for damage of any kind occurring to the Property, unless such damage is caused by their
 348 negligence or intentional misconduct.

349 **24. NONDISCRIMINATION.** The parties agree not to discriminate unlawfully against any prospective buyer because
 350 of the race, creed, color, sex, sexual orientation, marital status, familial status, physical or mental disability, handicap,
 351 religion, national origin or ancestry of such person.

352 **25. RECOMMENDATION OF LEGAL AND TAX COUNSEL.** By signing this document, Seller acknowledges that
 353 Broker has advised that this document has important legal consequences and has recommended consultation with
 354 legal and tax or other counsel before signing this Seller Listing Contract.

355 **26. MEDIATION.** If a dispute arises relating to this Seller Listing Contract, prior to or after closing, and is not resolved,
 356 the parties must first proceed in good faith to submit the matter to mediation. Mediation is a process in which the
 357 parties meet with an impartial person who helps to resolve the dispute informally and confidentially. Mediators cannot
 358 impose binding decisions. The parties to the dispute must agree, in writing, before any settlement is binding. The
 359 parties will jointly appoint an acceptable mediator and will share equally in the cost of such mediation. The mediation,
 360 unless otherwise agreed, will terminate in the event the entire dispute is not resolved within 30 calendar days of the
 361 date written notice requesting mediation is delivered by one party to the other at the other party's last known address.

362 **27. ATTORNEY FEES.** In the event of any arbitration or litigation relating to this Seller Listing Contract, the arbitrator
 363 or court must award to the prevailing party all reasonable costs and expenses, including attorney and legal fees.

383 **31.3. Choice of Law.** This Seller Listing Contract and all disputes arising hereunder are governed by and
 384 construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Colorado that would be applicable to Colorado residents
 385 who sign a contract in this state for property located in Colorado.

386 **32. MODIFICATION OF THIS SELLER LISTING CONTRACT.** No subsequent modification of any of the terms of this
 387 Seller Listing Contract is valid, binding upon the parties, or enforceable unless made in writing and signed by the parties.
