**ORDER (I) AUTHORIZING THE SALE OF 218 CRYSTAL CANYON DRIVE,
CARBONDALE, COLORADO PROPERTY OWNED BY THE DEBTORS FREE AND
CLEAR OF LIENS, CLAIMS, ENCUMBRANCES, AND OTHER INTERESTS;
(II) APPROVING RELATED PURCHASE AGREEMENT; AND
(III) GRANTING RELATED RELIEF**

Upon the motion (the "Motion")² filed by the above-captioned debtors and debtors in possession (collectively, the "Debtors") in these chapter 11 cases (the "Chapter 11 Cases") for entry of an order (i) authorizing the sale (the "Sale") of certain real property owned by the Debtor Sachs Bridge Investments, LLC (the "Seller") located at 218 Crystal Canyon Drive, Colorado 81623 (the "Land"), together with Seller's right, title, and interest in and to the buildings located thereon and any other improvements and fixtures located thereon (collectively, the "Improvements" and together with the Land, the "Real Property"), and any and all of the Seller's right, title, and interest in and to the tangible personal property and equipment listed in the Purchase Agreement and remaining on the Real Property as of the date of the closing of the Sale (collectively, the "Personal Property" and, together with the Real Property, the "Property")

on an “as is, where is” basis, free and clear of any and all liens, claims, encumbrances, and other interests to Frank Goldsmith and Cynthia Goldsmith (together with any assignee, the “Purchaser”) pursuant to the terms and conditions of that certain Contract to Buy and Sell Real Estate dated as of October 29, 2018 (as may be amended, supplemented, or otherwise modified from time to time, the “Purchase Agreement”) by and between the Seller and the Purchaser, a copy of which is attached as Exhibit 1 hereto; (ii) authorizing and approving the terms of the Purchase Agreement, and (iii) granting certain related relief; and the Court having jurisdiction to consider the Motion and the relief requested therein in accordance with 28 U.S.C. §§ 157 and 1334; and the Court having found that the legal and factual bases set forth in the Motion and the *Declaration of Bradley D. Sharp in Support of Debtors’ Motion to Sell 218 Crystal Canyon Drive, Carbondale, Colorado Property* establish good and sufficient cause for granting the Motion; and it appearing that the relief requested in the Motion is appropriate in the context of these Chapter 11 Cases and in the best interests of the Debtors and their respective estates, their creditors, and all other parties-in-interest; and it appearing that notice of the Motion was adequate and proper under the circumstances of these Chapter 11 Cases, and that no other or further notice need be given; and after due deliberation and sufficient cause appearing therefor,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:

1. The Motion is GRANTED as set forth herein.
2. The Purchase Agreement is authorized and approved in its entirety.
3. Pursuant to sections 105 and 363 of the Bankruptcy Code, the Debtors are authorized, in their discretion and in the exercise of their business judgment, to sell the Property pursuant to the Purchase Agreement free and clear of all liens, claims, interests, and encumbrances, to perform all obligations under the Purchase Agreement (including payment of

the Broker Fee and the Other Closing Costs out of the proceeds of the Sale), and to take any other reasonable actions that may be necessary in the Debtors' good faith business judgment to effectuate closing of the Sale, and that any actions taken by the Debtors necessary or desirable to consummate such transactions prior to the entry of this Order are hereby ratified.

4. The Debtors and any intermediary financial institution, title company, and closing attorney participating in the closings of the Sale are authorized to transfer title and deed property, and take any other actions as may be necessary to transfer ownership of the Property to the Purchaser.

5. All persons and entities holding liens, claims, interests or encumbrances with respect to the Property are hereby barred from asserting such liens, claims, interests or encumbrances against the Purchaser, its successors or assigns, or the Property.

6. All proceeds of the Sale (net of the Broker Fee and Other Closing Costs) shall be paid to the Debtors into the general account of Debtor Woodbridge Group of Companies, LLC, and such net proceeds shall be disbursed and otherwise treated by the Debtors in accordance with the *Final Order on Debtors' Motion for Entry of Interim and Final Orders (I) Pursuant to 11 U.S.C. §§ 105, 361, 362, 363, 364, 507, and 552 Authorizing Debtors to (A) Obtain Postpetition Secured Financing, (B) Use Cash Collateral, (C) Grant Adequate Protection to Prepetition Secured Parties; (II) Modifying the Automatic Stay; (III) Scheduling a Final Hearing Pursuant to Bankruptcy Rules 4001(b) and 4001(c); and (IV) Granting Related Relief* [D.I. 724] (the "Final DIP Order").

7. The Debtors are authorized and empowered to pay the Broker Fee to Sotheby's out of the sale proceeds in an amount up to 2.5% of the gross Sale proceeds.

8. The Purchase Agreement is undertaken by the Debtors and Purchaser in good faith and that, pursuant to section 363(m) of the Bankruptcy Code, the reversal or modification on appeal of any sale consummated pursuant to the terms of this Order shall not affect the validity of such sale unless such sale was stayed pending appeal.

9. Filing of a copy of this Order in the county in which the Property is situated may be relied upon by all title insurers in order to issue title insurance policies on the Property.

10. Any title insurer, escrow agent, or other intermediary participating in a closing of the Sale of the Property is authorized to disburse all funds at the closing of the Sale pursuant to the applicable settlement statement or escrow instructions provided by the parties to such Sale.

11. The Debtors shall be authorized and empowered to take any necessary actions to implement and effectuate the terms of this Order.

12. The terms and conditions of this Order shall be immediately effective and enforceable upon its entry notwithstanding any applicability of Bankruptcy Rule 6004(h).


13. The terms and provisions of this Order and any actions taken pursuant hereto shall (i) survive entry of any order converting the Debtors' cases to chapter 7 or dismissing the Debtors' cases (or any of them), and (ii) continue in this or any superseding case under the Bankruptcy Code of any of the Debtors.

14. The provisions of this Order shall be binding upon the Debtors and their successors and assigns, including, without limitation, any trustee or other fiduciary hereafter appointed as legal representative of the Debtors or with respect to property of the estates of the Debtors, whether under chapter 11 of the Bankruptcy Code, any confirmed plan, or any subsequent chapter 7 case.

15. Notice of the Motion as provided therein shall be deemed good and sufficient notice of such motion and to have satisfied Bankruptcy Rule 6004(a).

16. This Court shall retain jurisdiction and power with respect to all matters arising from or related to the interpretation and implementation of this Order.

AGREEMENT

1. AGREEMENT. Buyer agrees to buy and Seller agrees to sell, the Property described below on the terms and conditions set forth in this contract (Contract).

2. PARTIES AND PROPERTY.

2.1. Buyer. Buyer, Frank Goldsmith and Cynthia Goldsmith , will take title to the Property described below as

Joint Tenants Tenants In Common Other .

2.2. No Assignability. This Contract Is Not assignable by Buyer unless otherwise specified in Additional Provisions.

2.3. Seller. Seller, Sachs Bridge Investments LLC , is the current owner of the Property described below.

2.4. Property. The Property is the following legally described real estate in the County of Garfield, Colorado:

Subdivision: RIVER VALLEY RANCH PH 7 Block: Z Lot: 3 16877 SQ FT, Section: 10, Township: 8, Range: 88

known as No. 218 Crystal Canyon Drive, Carbondale, CO 81623, together with the interests, easements, rights, benefits, improvements and attached fixtures appurtenant thereto, and all interest of Seller in vacated streets and alleys adjacent thereto, except as herein excluded (Property).

2.5. Inclusions. The Purchase Price includes the following items (Inclusions):

2.5.1. Inclusions. The following items, whether fixtures or personal property, are included in the Purchase Price unless excluded under Exclusions:

If any additional items are attached to the Property after the date of this Contract, such additional items are also included in the Purchase Price.

2.5.2. Personal Property - Conveyance. Any personal property must be conveyed at Closing by Seller free and clear of all taxes (except personal property taxes for the year of Closing), liens and encumbrances, except .

Conveyance of all personal property will be by bill of sale or other applicable legal instrument.

2.6. Exclusions. The following items are excluded (Exclusions):

2.7. Water Rights, Well Rights, Water and Sewer Taps.

2.7.1. Deeded Water Rights. The following legally described water rights:

Any deeded water rights will be conveyed by a good and sufficient deed at Closing.

2.7.2. Other Rights Relating to Water. The following rights relating to water not included in

§§ 2.7.1, 2.7.3, 2.7.4 and 2.7.5, will be transferred to Buyer at Closing:

2.7.3. Well Rights. Seller agrees to supply required information to Buyer about the well. Buyer understands that if the well to be transferred is a "Small Capacity Well" or a "Domestic Exempt Water Well," used for ordinary household purposes, Buyer must, prior to or at Closing, complete a Change in Ownership form for the well. If an existing well has not been registered with the Colorado Division of Water Resources in the Department of Natural Resources (Division), Buyer must complete a registration of existing well form for the well and pay the cost of registration. If no person will be providing a closing service in connection with the transaction, Buyer must file the form with the Division within sixty days after Closing. The Well Permit # is .

2.7.4. Water Stock Certificates. The water stock certificates to be transferred at Closing are as follows:

2.7.5. Water and Sewer Taps. The parties agree that water and sewer taps listed below for the Property are being conveyed as part of the Purchase Price as follows:

If any water or sewer taps are included in the sale, Buyer is advised to obtain, from the provider, written confirmation of the amount remaining to be paid, if any, time and other restrictions for transfer and use of the taps.

2.7.6. Conveyance. If Buyer is to receive any rights to water pursuant to § 2.7.2 (Other Rights Relating to Water), § 2.7.3 (Well Rights), or § 2.7.4 (Water Stock Certificates), Seller agrees to convey such rights to Buyer by executing the applicable legal instrument at Closing.

2.8. Growing Crops. With respect to growing crops, Seller and Buyer agree as follows:

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3.1. Applicability of Terms. Any box checked in this Contract means the corresponding provision applies. Any box, blank or line in this Contract left blank or completed with the abbreviation "N/A", or the word "Deleted" means such provision, including any deadline, is not applicable and the corresponding provision of this Contract to which reference is made is deleted. If no box is checked in a provision that contains a selection of "None", such provision means that "None" applies.

The abbreviation "MEC" (mutual execution of this Contract) means the date upon which both parties have signed this Contract.

4. PURCHASE PRICE AND TERMS.

4.1. Price and Terms. The Purchase Price set forth below is payable in U.S. Dollars by Buyer as follows:

4.2. Seller Concession. At Closing, Seller will credit to Buyer \$ (Seller Concession). The Seller Concession may be used for any Buyer fee, cost, charge or expenditure to the extent the amount is allowed by the Buyer's lender and is included in the Closing Statement or Closing Disclosure, at Closing. Examples of allowable items to be paid for by the Seller Concession include, but are not limited to: Buyer's closing costs, loan discount points, loan origination fees, prepaid items and any other fee, cost, charge, expense or expenditure. Seller Concession is in addition to any sum Seller has agreed to pay or credit Buyer elsewhere in this Contract.

4.3. Earnest Money. The Earnest Money set forth in this section, in the form of a **Check or Wire Transfer**, will be payable to and held by **Commonwealth Title, Glenwood Springs** (Earnest Money Holder), in its trust account, on behalf of both Seller and Buyer. The Earnest Money deposit must be tendered, by Buyer, with this Contract unless the parties mutually agree to an **Alternative Earnest Money Deadline** for its payment. The parties authorize delivery of the Earnest Money deposit to the company conducting the Closing (Closing Company), if any, at or before Closing. In the event Earnest Money Holder has agreed to have interest on Earnest Money deposits transferred to a fund established for the purpose of providing affordable housing to Colorado residents, Seller and Buyer acknowledge and agree that any interest accruing on the Earnest Money deposited with the Earnest Money Holder in this transaction will be transferred to such fund.

4.3.1. Alternative Earnest Money Deadline. The deadline for delivering the Earnest Money, if other than at the time of tender of this Contract, is as set forth as the **Alternative Earnest Money Deadline**.

4.3.2. Return of Earnest Money. If Buyer has a Right to Terminate and timely terminates, Buyer is entitled to the return of Earnest Money as provided in this Contract. If this Contract is terminated as set forth in § 25 and, except as provided in § 24, if the Earnest Money has not already been returned following receipt of a Notice to Terminate, Seller agrees to execute and return to Buyer or Broker working with Buyer, written mutual instructions (e.g., Earnest Money Release form), within three days of Seller's receipt of such form.

4.4. Form of Funds; Time of Payment; Available Funds.

4.4.1. Good Funds. All amounts payable by the parties at Closing, including any loan proceeds, Cash at Closing and closing costs, must be in funds that comply with all applicable Colorado laws, including electronic transfer funds, certified check, savings and loan teller's check and cashier's check (Good Funds).

4.4.2. Time of Payment; Available Funds. All funds, including the Purchase Price to be paid by Buyer, must be paid before or at Closing or as otherwise agreed in writing between the parties to allow disbursement by Closing Company at Closing **OR SUCH NONPAYING PARTY WILL BE IN DEFAULT**. Buyer represents that Buyer, as of the date of this Contract, **Does** **Does Not** have funds that are immediately verifiable and available in an amount not less than the amount stated as Cash at Closing in § 4.1.

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284 **6. APPRAISAL PROVISIONS.**

285 **6.1. Appraisal Definition.** An "Appraisal" is an opinion of value prepared by a licensed or certified
286 appraiser, engaged on behalf of Buyer or Buyer's lender, to determine the Property's market value (Appraised
287 Value). The Appraisal may also set forth certain lender requirements, replacements, removals or repairs
288 necessary on or to the Property as a condition for the Property to be valued at the Appraised Value.

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290 **6.2. Appraisal Condition.** The applicable appraisal provision set forth below applies to the
291 respective loan type set forth in § 4.5.3, or if a cash transaction (i.e. no financing), § 6.2.1 applies.

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293 **6.2.1. Conventional/Other.** Buyer has the right to obtain an Appraisal. If the Appraised Value
294 is less than the Purchase Price, or if the Appraisal is not received by Buyer on or before **Appraisal Deadline**
295 Buyer may, on or before **Appraisal Objection Deadline**, notwithstanding § 8.3 or § 13:

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297 **6.2.1.1. Notice to Terminate.** Notify Seller in writing that this Contract is terminated; or

298 **6.2.1.2. Appraisal Objection.** Deliver to Seller a written objection accompanied by
299 either a copy of the Appraisal or written notice from lender that confirms the Appraisal Value is less than the
300 Purchase Price.

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302 **6.2.1.3. Appraisal Resolution.** If an Appraisal Objection is received by Seller, on or
303 before **Appraisal Objection Deadline**, and if Buyer and Seller have not agreed in writing to a settlement
304 thereof on or before **Appraisal Resolution Deadline** (§ 3), this Contract will terminate on the **Appraisal**
305 **Resolution Deadline**, unless Seller receives Buyer's written withdrawal of the Appraisal Objection before such
306 termination, i.e., on or before expiration of **Appraisal Resolution Deadline**.

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308 **6.3. Lender Property Requirements.** If the lender imposes any requirements, replacements,
309 removals or repairs, including any specified in the Appraisal (Lender Requirements) to be made to the Property
310 (e.g., roof repair, repainting), beyond those matters already agreed to by Seller in this Contract, Seller has the
311 Right to Terminate under § 25.1, (notwithstanding § 10 of this Contract), on or before three days following
312 Seller's receipt of the Lender Requirements, in Seller's sole subjective discretion. Seller's Right to Terminate in
313 this § 6.3 does not apply if, on or before any termination by Seller pursuant to this § 6.3: (1) the parties enter
314 into a written agreement regarding the Lender Requirements; or (2) the Lender Requirements have been
315 completed; or (3) the satisfaction of the Lender Requirements is waived in writing by Buyer.

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317 **6.4. Cost of Appraisal.** Cost of the Appraisal to be obtained after the date of this Contract must be
318 timely paid by Buyer Seller. The cost of the Appraisal may include any and all fees paid to the
319 appraiser, appraisal management company, lender's agent or all three.

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324 **7. OWNERS' ASSOCIATION.** This Section is applicable if the Property is located within a
325 Common Interest Community and subject to such declaration.

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327 **7.1. Common Interest Community Disclosure.** THE PROPERTY IS LOCATED WITHIN A
328 COMMON INTEREST COMMUNITY AND IS SUBJECT TO THE DECLARATION FOR THE COMMUNITY.
329 THE OWNER OF THE PROPERTY WILL BE REQUIRED TO BE A MEMBER OF THE OWNERS'
330 ASSOCIATION FOR THE COMMUNITY AND WILL BE SUBJECT TO THE BYLAWS AND RULES AND
331 REGULATIONS OF THE ASSOCIATION. THE DECLARATION, BYLAWS, AND RULES AND
332 REGULATIONS WILL IMPOSE FINANCIAL OBLIGATIONS UPON THE OWNER OF THE PROPERTY,
333 INCLUDING AN OBLIGATION TO PAY ASSESSMENTS OF THE ASSOCIATION. IF THE OWNER DOES
334 NOT PAY THESE ASSESSMENTS, THE ASSOCIATION COULD PLACE A LIEN ON THE PROPERTY AND
335 POSSIBLY SELL IT TO PAY THE DEBT. THE DECLARATION, BYLAWS, AND RULES AND
336 REGULATIONS OF THE COMMUNITY MAY PROHIBIT THE OWNER FROM MAKING CHANGES TO THE
337 PROPERTY WITHOUT AN ARCHITECTURAL REVIEW BY THE ASSOCIATION (OR A COMMITTEE OF
338 THE ASSOCIATION) AND THE APPROVAL OF THE ASSOCIATION. PURCHASERS OF PROPERTY
339 WITHIN THE COMMON INTEREST COMMUNITY SHOULD INVESTIGATE THE FINANCIAL OBLIGATIONS
340 OF MEMBERS OF THE ASSOCIATION. PURCHASERS SHOULD CAREFULLY READ THE DECLARATION
341 FOR THE COMMUNITY AND THE BYLAWS AND RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE ASSOCIATION.

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343 **7.2. Owners' Association Documents.** Owners' Association Documents (Association
344 Documents) consist of the following:

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346 **7.2.1.** All Owners' Association declarations, articles of incorporation, bylaws, articles of
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351 organization, operating agreements, rules and regulations, party wall agreements;
 352 **7.2.2.** Minutes of most recent annual owners' meeting;
 353 **7.2.3.** Minutes of any directors' or managers' meetings during the six-month period
 354 immediately preceding the date of this Contract. If none of the preceding minutes exist, then the most recent
 355 minutes, if any (§§ 7.2.1, 7.2.2 and 7.2.3, collectively, Governing Documents); and
 356 **7.2.4.** The most recent financial documents which consist of: (1) annual and most recent
 357 balance sheet, (2) annual and most recent income and expenditures statement, (3) annual budget, (4) reserve
 358 study, and (5) notice of unpaid assessments, if any (collectively, Financial Documents).

359 **7.3. Association Documents to Buyer.**

360 **7.3.1. Seller to Provide Association Documents.** Seller is obligated to provide to Buyer the
 361 Association Documents, at Seller's expense, on or before **Association Documents Deadline**. Seller
 362 authorizes the Association to provide the Association Documents to Buyer, at Seller's expense. Seller's
 363 obligation to provide the Association Documents is fulfilled upon Buyer's receipt of the Association Documents,
 364 regardless of who provides such documents.

365 **7.4. Conditional on Buyer's Review.** Buyer has the right to review the Association Documents.
 366 Buyer has the Right to Terminate under § 25.1, on or before **Association Documents Objection Deadline**,
 367 based on any unsatisfactory provision in any of the Association Documents, in Buyer's sole subjective
 368 discretion. Should Buyer receive the Association Documents after **Association Documents Deadline**, Buyer,
 369 at Buyer's option, has the Right to Terminate under § 25.1 by Buyer's Notice to Terminate received by Seller
 370 on or before ten days after Buyer's receipt of the Association Documents. If Buyer does not receive the
 371 Association Documents, or if Buyer's Notice to Terminate would otherwise be required to be received by Seller
 372 after **Closing Date**, Buyer's Notice to Terminate must be received by Seller on or before Closing. If Seller does
 373 not receive Buyer's Notice to Terminate within such time, Buyer accepts the provisions of the Association
 374 Documents as satisfactory, and Buyer waives any Right to Terminate under this provision, notwithstanding the
 375 provisions of § 8.6 (Right of First Refusal or Contract Approval).

376 **8. TITLE INSURANCE, RECORD TITLE AND OFF-RECORD TITLE.**

377 **8.1. Evidence of Record Title.**

378 **8.1.1. Seller Selects Title Insurance Company.** If this box is checked, Seller will select the
 379 title insurance company to furnish the owner's title insurance policy at Seller's expense. On or before **Record**
 380 **Title Deadline**, Seller must furnish to Buyer, a current commitment for an owner's title insurance policy (Title
 381 Commitment), in an amount equal to the Purchase Price, or if this box is checked, an **Abstract of Title**
 382 certified to a current date. Seller will cause the title insurance policy to be issued and delivered to Buyer as
 383 soon as practicable at or after Closing.

384 **8.1.2. Buyer Selects Title Insurance Company.** If this box is checked, Buyer will select the
 385 title insurance company to furnish the owner's title insurance policy at Buyer's expense. On or before **Record**
 386 **Title Deadline**, Buyer must furnish to Seller, a current commitment for owner's title insurance policy (Title
 387 Commitment), in an amount equal to the Purchase Price.

388 If neither box in § 8.1.1 or § 8.1.2 is checked, § 8.1.1 applies.

389 **8.1.3. Owner's Extended Coverage (OEC).** The Title Commitment **Will** **Will Not**
 390 contain Owner's Extended Coverage (OEC). If the Title Commitment is to contain OEC, it will commit to delete
 391 or insure over the standard exceptions which relate to: (1) parties in possession, (2) unrecorded easements,
 392 (3) survey matters, (4) unrecorded mechanics' liens, (5) gap period (period between the effective date and time
 393 of commitment to the date and time the deed is recorded), and (6) unpaid taxes, assessments and
 394 unredeemed tax sales prior to the year of Closing. Any additional premium expense to obtain OEC will be paid
 395 by **Buyer** **Seller** **One-Half by Buyer and One-Half by Seller** **Other** .

396 Regardless of whether the Contract requires OEC, the Title Insurance Commitment may not provide OEC or
 397 delete or insure over any or all of the standard exceptions for OEC. The Title Insurance Company may require
 398 a New Survey or New ILC, defined below, among other requirements for OEC. If the Title Insurance
 399 Commitment is not satisfactory to Buyer, Buyer has a right to object under § 8.4 (Right to Object to Title,
 400 Resolution).

401 **8.1.4. Title Documents.** Title Documents consist of the following: (1) copies of any plats,
 402 declarations, covenants, conditions and restrictions burdening the Property, and (2) copies of any other
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421 documents (or, if illegible, summaries of such documents) listed in the schedule of exceptions (Exceptions) in
 422 the Title Commitment furnished to Buyer (collectively, Title Documents).
 423

424 **8.1.5. Copies of Title Documents.** Buyer must receive, on or before **Record Title Deadline**,
 425 copies of all Title Documents. This requirement pertains only to documents as shown of record in the office of
 426 the clerk and recorder in the county where the Property is located. The cost of furnishing copies of the
 427 documents required in this Section will be at the expense of the party or parties obligated to pay for the
 428 owner's title insurance policy.
 429

430 **8.1.6. Existing Abstracts of Title.** Seller must deliver to Buyer copies of any abstracts of
 431 title covering all or any portion of the Property (Abstract of Title) in Seller's possession on or before **Record**
 432 **Title Deadline**.
 433

434 **8.2. Record Title.** Buyer has the right to review and object to the Abstract of Title or Title
 435 Commitment and any of the Title Documents as set forth in § 8.4 (Right to Object to Title, Resolution) on or
 436 before **Record Title Objection Deadline**. Buyer's objection may be based on any unsatisfactory form or
 437 content of Title Commitment or Abstract of Title, notwithstanding § 13, or any other unsatisfactory title
 438 condition, in Buyer's sole subjective discretion. If the Abstract of Title, Title Commitment or Title Documents are
 439 not received by Buyer on or before the **Record Title Deadline**, or if there is an endorsement to the Title
 440 Commitment that adds a new Exception to title, a copy of the new Exception to title and the modified Title
 441 Commitment will be delivered to Buyer. Buyer has until the earlier of Closing or ten days after receipt of such
 442 documents by Buyer to review and object to: (1) any required Title Document not timely received by Buyer, (2)
 443 any change to the Abstract of Title, Title Commitment or Title Documents, or (3) any endorsement to the Title
 444 Commitment. If Seller receives Buyer's Notice to Terminate or Notice of Title Objection, pursuant to this § 8.2
 445 (Record Title), any title objection by Buyer is governed by the provisions set forth in § 8.4 (Right to Object to
 446 Title, Resolution). If Seller has fulfilled all Seller's obligations, if any, to deliver to Buyer all documents required
 447 by § 8.1 (Evidence of Record Title) and Seller does not receive Buyer's Notice to Terminate or Notice of Title
 448 Objection by the applicable deadline specified above, Buyer accepts the condition of title as disclosed by the
 449 Abstract of Title, Title Commitment and Title Documents as satisfactory.
 450

451 **8.3. Off-Record Title.** Seller must deliver to Buyer, on or before **Off-Record Title Deadline**, true
 452 copies of all existing surveys in Seller's possession pertaining to the Property and must disclose to Buyer all
 453 easements, liens (including, without limitation, governmental improvements approved, but not yet installed) or
 454 other title matters (including, without limitation, rights of first refusal and options) not shown by public records,
 455 of which Seller has actual knowledge (Off-Record Matters). Buyer has the right to inspect the Property to
 456 investigate if any third party has any right in the Property not shown by public records (e.g., unrecorded
 457 easement, boundary line discrepancy or water rights). Buyer's Notice to Terminate or Notice of Title Objection
 458 of any unsatisfactory condition (whether disclosed by Seller or revealed by such inspection, notwithstanding §
 459 8.2 and § 13), in Buyer's sole subjective discretion, must be received by Seller on or before **Off-Record Title**
 460 **Objection Deadline**. If an Off-Record Matter is received by Buyer after the **Off-Record Title Deadline**, Buyer
 461 has until the earlier of Closing or ten days after receipt by Buyer to review and object to such Off-Record
 462 Matter. If Seller receives Buyer's Notice to Terminate or Notice of Title Objection pursuant to this § 8.3
 463 (Off-Record Title), any title objection by Buyer and this Contract are governed by the provisions set forth in §
 464 8.4 (Right to Object to Title, Resolution). If Seller does not receive Buyer's Notice to Terminate or Notice of
 465 Title Objection by the applicable deadline specified above, Buyer accepts title subject to such rights, if any, of
 466 third parties of which Buyer has actual knowledge.
 467

468 **8.4. Right to Object to Title, Resolution.** Buyer's right to object to any title matters includes, but is
 469 not limited to those matters set forth in §§ 8.2 (Record Title), 8.3 (Off-Record Title) and 13 (Transfer of Title), in
 470 Buyer's sole subjective discretion. If Buyer objects to any title matter, on or before the applicable deadline,
 471 Buyer has the following options:
 472

473 **8.4.1. Title Objection, Resolution.** If Seller receives Buyer's written notice objecting to any
 474 title matter (Notice of Title Objection) on or before the applicable deadline, and if Buyer and Seller have not
 475 agreed to a written settlement thereof on or before **Title Resolution Deadline**, this Contract will terminate on
 476 the expiration of **Title Resolution Deadline**, unless Seller receives Buyer's written withdrawal of Buyer's
 477 Notice of Title Objection (i.e., Buyer's written notice to waive objection to such items and waives the Right to
 478 Terminate for that reason), on or before expiration of **Title Resolution Deadline**. If either the Record Title
 479 Deadline or the Off-Record Title Deadline, or both, are extended to the earlier of Closing or ten days after
 480

491 receipt of the applicable documents by Buyer, pursuant to § 8.2 (Record Title) or § 8.3 (Off-Record Title), the
 492 Title Resolution Deadline also will be automatically extended to the earlier of Closing or fifteen days after
 493 Buyer's receipt of the applicable documents; or
 494

495 **8.4.2. Title Objection, Right to Terminate.** Buyer may exercise the Right to Terminate under
 496 § 25.1, on or before the applicable deadline, based on any unsatisfactory title matter, in Buyer's sole subjective
 497 discretion.
 498

499 **8.5. Special Taxing Districts. SPECIAL TAXING DISTRICTS MAY BE SUBJECT TO GENERAL**
 500 **OBLIGATION INDEBTEDNESS THAT IS PAID BY REVENUES PRODUCED FROM ANNUAL TAX LEVIES**
 501 **ON THE TAXABLE PROPERTY WITHIN SUCH DISTRICTS. PROPERTY OWNERS IN SUCH DISTRICTS**
 502 **MAY BE PLACED AT RISK FOR INCREASED MILL LEVIES AND TAX TO SUPPORT THE SERVICING OF**
 503 **SUCH DEBT WHERE CIRCUMSTANCES ARISE RESULTING IN THE INABILITY OF SUCH A DISTRICT**
 504 **TO DISCHARGE SUCH INDEBTEDNESS WITHOUT SUCH AN INCREASE IN MILL LEVIES. BUYERS**
 505 **SHOULD INVESTIGATE THE SPECIAL TAXING DISTRICTS IN WHICH THE PROPERTY IS LOCATED BY**
 506 **CONTACTING THE COUNTY TREASURER, BY REVIEWING THE CERTIFICATE OF TAXES DUE FOR**
 507 **THE PROPERTY, AND BY OBTAINING FURTHER INFORMATION FROM THE BOARD OF COUNTY**
 508 **COMMISSIONERS, THE COUNTY CLERK AND RECORDER, OR THE COUNTY ASSESSOR.**
 509

510 Buyer has the Right to Terminate under § 25.1, on or before **Off-Record Title Objection Deadline**, based
 511 on any unsatisfactory effect of the Property being located within a special taxing district, in Buyer's sole
 512 subjective discretion.
 513

514 **8.6. Right of First Refusal or Contract Approval.** If there is a right of first refusal on the Property
 515 or a right to approve this Contract, Seller must promptly submit this Contract according to the terms and
 516 conditions of such right. If the holder of the right of first refusal exercises such right or the holder of a right to
 517 approve disapproves this Contract, this Contract will terminate. If the right of first refusal is waived explicitly or
 518 expires, or the Contract is approved, this Contract will remain in full force and effect. Seller must promptly
 519 notify Buyer in writing of the foregoing. If expiration or waiver of the right of first refusal or approval of this
 520 Contract has not occurred on or before **Right of First Refusal Deadline**, this Contract will then terminate.
 521

522 **8.7. Title Advisory.** The Title Documents affect the title, ownership and use of the Property and
 523 should be reviewed carefully. Additionally, other matters not reflected in the Title Documents may affect the
 524 title, ownership and use of the Property, including, without limitation, boundary lines and encroachments,
 525 set-back requirements, area, zoning, building code violations, unrecorded easements and claims of
 526 easements, leases and other unrecorded agreements, water on or under the Property, and various laws and
 527 governmental regulations concerning land use, development and environmental matters.
 528

529 **8.7.1. OIL, GAS, WATER AND MINERAL DISCLOSURE. THE SURFACE ESTATE OF THE**
 530 **PROPERTY MAY BE OWNED SEPARATELY FROM THE UNDERLYING MINERAL ESTATE, AND**
 531 **TRANSFER OF THE SURFACE ESTATE MAY NOT NECESSARILY INCLUDE TRANSFER OF THE**
 532 **MINERAL ESTATE OR WATER RIGHTS. THIRD PARTIES MAY OWN OR LEASE INTERESTS IN OIL, GAS,**
 533 **OTHER MINERALS, GEOTHERMAL ENERGY OR WATER ON OR UNDER THE SURFACE OF THE**
 534 **PROPERTY, WHICH INTERESTS MAY GIVE THEM RIGHTS TO ENTER AND USE THE SURFACE OF THE**
 535 **PROPERTY TO ACCESS THE MINERAL ESTATE, OIL, GAS OR WATER.**
 536

537 **8.7.2. SURFACE USE AGREEMENT. THE USE OF THE SURFACE ESTATE OF THE**
 538 **PROPERTY TO ACCESS THE OIL, GAS OR MINERALS MAY BE GOVERNED BY A SURFACE USE**
 539 **AGREEMENT, A MEMORANDUM OR OTHER NOTICE OF WHICH MAY BE RECORDED WITH THE**
 540 **COUNTY CLERK AND RECORDER.**
 541

542 **8.7.3. OIL AND GAS ACTIVITY. OIL AND GAS ACTIVITY THAT MAY OCCUR ON OR**
 543 **ADJACENT TO THE PROPERTY MAY INCLUDE, BUT IS NOT LIMITED TO, SURVEYING, DRILLING,**
 544 **WELL COMPLETION OPERATIONS, STORAGE, OIL AND GAS, OR PRODUCTION FACILITIES,**
 545 **PRODUCING WELLS, REWORKING OF CURRENT WELLS, AND GAS GATHERING AND PROCESSING**
 546 **FACILITIES.**
 547

548 **8.7.4. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION. BUYER IS ENCOURAGED TO SEEK ADDITIONAL**
 549 **INFORMATION REGARDING OIL AND GAS ACTIVITY ON OR ADJACENT TO THE PROPERTY,**
 550 **INCLUDING DRILLING PERMIT APPLICATIONS. THIS INFORMATION MAY BE AVAILABLE FROM THE**
 551 **COLORADO OIL AND GAS CONSERVATION COMMISSION.**
 552

553 **8.7.5. Title Insurance Exclusions.** Matters set forth in this Section, and others, may be
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561 excepted, excluded from, or not covered by the owner's title insurance policy.

562 **8.8. Consult an Attorney.** Buyer is advised to timely consult legal counsel with respect to all such
 563 matters as there are strict time limits provided in this Contract (e.g., **Record Title Objection Deadline** and
 564 **Off-Record Title Objection Deadline**).

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 566
 567 **9. NEW ILC, NEW SURVEY.**

568 **9.1. New ILC or New Survey.** If the box is checked, a **New Improvement Location Certificate**
 569 **(New ILC)** **New Survey** in the form of Improvement Survey is required and the following will apply:

570 **9.1.1. Ordering of New ILC or New Survey.** **Seller** **Buyer** will order the New ILC or New
 571 Survey. The New ILC or New Survey may also be a previous ILC or survey that is in the above-required form,
 572 certified and updated as of a date after the date of this Contract.

573 **9.1.2. Payment for New ILC or New Survey.** The cost of the New ILC or New Survey will be
 574 paid, on or before Closing, by: **Seller** **Buyer** or:

575 **9.1.3. Delivery of New ILC or New Survey.** Buyer, Seller, the issuer of the Title Commitment (or
 576 the provider of the opinion of title if an Abstract of Title), and will receive a New ILC or New Survey on or
 577 before **New ILC or New Survey Deadline**.

578 **9.1.4. Certification of New ILC or New Survey.** The New ILC or New Survey will be certified by
 579 the surveyor to all those who are to receive the New ILC or New Survey.

580 **9.2. Buyer's Right to Waive or Change New ILC or New Survey Selection.** Buyer may select a
 581 New ILC or New Survey different than initially specified in this Contract if there is no additional cost to Seller or
 582 change to the **New ILC or New Survey Objection Deadline**. Buyer may, in Buyer's sole subjective discretion,
 583 waive a New ILC or New Survey if done prior to Seller incurring any cost for the same.

584 **9.3. New ILC or New Survey Objection.** Buyer has the right to review and object to the **New ILC** or
 585 **New Survey**. If the **New ILC** or **New Survey** is not timely received by Buyer or is unsatisfactory to Buyer, in
 586 Buyer's sole subjective discretion, Buyer may, on or before **New ILC or New Survey Objection Deadline**,
 587 notwithstanding § 8.3 or § 13:

588 **9.3.1. Notice to Terminate.** Notify Seller in writing that this Contract is terminated; or

589 **9.3.2. New ILC or New Survey Objection.** Deliver to Seller a written description of any matter
 590 that was to be shown or is shown in the **New ILC** or **New Survey** that is unsatisfactory and that Buyer requires
 591 Seller to correct.

592 **9.3.3. New ILC or New Survey Resolution.** If a **New ILC** or **New Survey Objection** is received
 593 by Seller, on or before **New ILC or New Survey Objection Deadline**, and if Buyer and Seller have not agreed
 594 in writing to a settlement thereof on or before **New ILC or New Survey Resolution Deadline**, this Contract will
 595 terminate on expiration of the **New ILC or New Survey Resolution Deadline**, unless Seller receives Buyer's
 596 written withdrawal of the **New ILC** or **New Survey Objection** before such termination, i.e., on or before
 597 expiration of **New ILC or New Survey Resolution Deadline**.

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 610 **DISCLOSURE, INSPECTION AND DUE DILIGENCE**

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 612 **10. PROPERTY DISCLOSURE, INSPECTION, INDEMNITY, INSURABILITY, DUE DILIGENCE AND**
 613 **SOURCE OF WATER.**

614 **10.1. Seller's Property Disclosure.** On or before **Seller's Property Disclosure Deadline**, Seller
 615 agrees to deliver to Buyer the most current version of the applicable Colorado Real Estate Commission's
 616 Seller's Property Disclosure form completed by Seller to Seller's actual knowledge, current as of the date of
 617 this Contract.

618 **10.2. Disclosure of Latent Defects; Present Condition.** Seller must disclose to Buyer any latent
 619 defects actually known by Seller. Seller agrees that disclosure of latent defects will be in writing. Except as
 620 otherwise provided in this Contract, Buyer acknowledges that Seller is conveying the Property to Buyer in an
 621 "As Is" condition, "Where Is" and "With All Faults."

622 **10.3. Inspection.** Unless otherwise provided in this Contract, Buyer, acting in good faith, has the right
 623 to have inspections (by one or more third parties, personally or both) of the Property and Inclusions
 624 (Inspection), at Buyer's expense. If (1) the physical condition of the Property, including, but not limited to, the
 625 roof, walls, structural integrity of the Property, the electrical, plumbing, HVAC and other mechanical systems of
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631 the Property, (2) the physical condition of the Inclusions, (3) service to the Property (including utilities and
 632 communication services), systems and components of the Property (e.g., heating and plumbing), (4) any
 633 proposed or existing transportation project, road, street or highway, or (5) any other activity, odor or noise
 634 (whether on or off the Property) and its effect or expected effect on the Property or its occupants is
 635 unsatisfactory, in Buyer's sole subjective discretion, Buyer may, on or before **Inspection Objection Deadline:**
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637 **10.3.1. Notice to Terminate.** Notify Seller in writing that this Contract is terminated; or
 638

639 **10.3.2. Inspection Objection.** Deliver to Seller a written description of any unsatisfactory
 640 physical condition that Buyer requires Seller to correct.
 641

642 **10.3.3. Inspection Resolution.** If an Inspection Objection is received by Seller, on or before
 643 **Inspection Objection Deadline**, and if Buyer and Seller have not agreed in writing to a settlement thereof on
 644 or before **Inspection Resolution Deadline**, this Contract will terminate on **Inspection Resolution Deadline**
 645 unless Seller receives Buyer's written withdrawal of the Inspection Objection before such termination, i.e., on
 646 or before expiration of **Inspection Resolution Deadline**.
 647

648 **10.4. Damage, Liens and Indemnity.** Buyer, except as otherwise provided in this Contract or other
 649 written agreement between the parties, is responsible for payment for all inspections, tests, surveys,
 650 engineering reports, or other reports performed at Buyer's request (Work) and must pay for any damage that
 651 occurs to the Property and Inclusions as a result of such Work. Buyer must not permit claims or liens of any
 652 kind against the Property for Work performed on the Property. Buyer agrees to indemnify, protect and hold
 653 Seller harmless from and against any liability, damage, cost or expense incurred by Seller and caused by any
 654 such Work, claim, or lien. This indemnity includes Seller's right to recover all costs and expenses incurred by
 655 Seller to defend against any such liability, damage, cost or expense, or to enforce this section, including
 656 Seller's reasonable attorney fees, legal fees and expenses. The provisions of this section survive the
 657 termination of this Contract. This § 10.4 does not apply to items performed pursuant to an Inspection
 658 Resolution.
 659

660 **10.5. Insurability.** Buyer has the right to review and object to the availability, terms and conditions of
 661 and premium for property insurance (Property Insurance). Buyer has the Right to Terminate under § 25.1, on
 662 or before **Property Insurance Objection Deadline**, based on any unsatisfactory provision of the Property
 663 Insurance, in Buyer's sole subjective discretion.
 664

665 **10.6. Due Diligence.**

666 **10.6.1. Due Diligence Documents.** If the respective box is checked, Seller agrees to deliver
 667 copies of the following documents and information pertaining to the Property (Due Diligence Documents) to
 668 Buyer on or before **Due Diligence Documents Delivery Deadline**:
 669

670 **10.6.1.1.** All contracts relating to the operation, maintenance and management of the
 671 Property;
 672

673 **10.6.1.2.** Property tax bills for the last years;
 674

675 **10.6.1.3.** As-built construction plans to the Property and the tenant improvements,
 676 including architectural, electrical, mechanical, and structural systems, engineering reports, and permanent
 677 Certificates of Occupancy, to the extent now available;
 678

679 **10.6.1.4.** A list of all Inclusions to be conveyed to Buyer;
 680

681 **10.6.1.5.** Operating statements for the past years;
 682

683 **10.6.1.6.** A rent roll accurate and correct to the date of this Contract;
 684

685 **10.6.1.7.** All current leases, including any amendments or other occupancy
 686 agreements, pertaining to the Property. Those leases or other occupancy agreements pertaining to the
 687 Property that survive Closing are as follows (Leases):
 688

689 **10.6.1.8.** A schedule of any tenant improvement work Seller is obligated to complete
 690 but has not yet been completed and capital improvement work either scheduled or in process on the date of
 691 this Contract;
 692

693 **10.6.1.9.** All insurance policies pertaining to the Property and copies of any claims
 694 which have been made for the past years;
 695

696 **10.6.1.10.** Soils reports, surveys and engineering reports or data pertaining to the
 697 Property (if not delivered earlier under § 8.3);
 698

699 **10.6.1.11.** Any and all existing documentation and reports regarding Phase I and II
 700 environmental reports, letters, test results, advisories, and similar documents respective to the existence or

701 nonexistence of asbestos, PCB transformers, or other toxic, hazardous or contaminated substances, and/or
 702 underground storage tanks and/or radon gas. If no reports are in Seller's possession or known to Seller, Seller
 703 warrants that no such reports are in Seller's possession or known to Seller;
 704 **10.6.1.12.** Any *Americans with Disabilities Act* reports, studies or surveys concerning
 705 the compliance of the Property with said Act;
 706 **10.6.1.13.** All permits, licenses and other building or use authorizations issued by any
 707 governmental authority with jurisdiction over the Property and written notice of any violation of any such
 708 permits, licenses or use authorizations, if any; and
 709 **10.6.1.14.** Other documents and information:

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 716 **10.6.2. Due Diligence Documents Review and Objection.** Buyer has the right to review and
 717 object to Due Diligence Documents. If the Due Diligence Documents are not supplied to Buyer or are
 718 unsatisfactory in Buyer's sole subjective discretion, Buyer may, on or before **Due Diligence Documents**
 719 **Objection Deadline**:

720 **10.6.2.1. Notice to Terminate.** Notify Seller in writing that this Contract is terminated;
 721 or

722 **10.6.2.2. Due Diligence Documents Objection.** Deliver to Seller a written description
 723 of any unsatisfactory Due Diligence Documents that Buyer requires Seller to correct.

724 **10.6.2.3. Due Diligence Documents Resolution.** If a Due Diligence Documents
 725 Objection is received by Seller, on or before **Due Diligence Documents Objection Deadline**, and if Buyer
 726 and Seller have not agreed in writing to a settlement thereof on or before **Due Diligence Documents**
 727 **Resolution Deadline**, this Contract will terminate on **Due Diligence Documents Resolution Deadline** unless
 728 Seller receives Buyer's written withdrawal of the Due Diligence Documents Objection before such termination,
 729 i.e., on or before expiration of **Due Diligence Documents Resolution Deadline**.

730 **10.6.3. Zoning.** Buyer has the Right to Terminate under § 25.1, on or before **Due Diligence**
 731 **Documents Objection Deadline**, based on any unsatisfactory zoning and any use restrictions imposed by
 732 any governmental agency with jurisdiction over the Property, in Buyer's sole subjective discretion.

733 **10.6.4. Due Diligence – Environmental, ADA.** Buyer has the right to obtain environmental
 734 inspections of the Property including Phase I and Phase II Environmental Site Assessments, as applicable.
 735 **Seller** **Buyer** will order or provide **Phase I Environmental Site Assessment, Phase II Environmental**
 736 **Site Assessment** (compliant with most current version of the applicable ASTM E1527 standard practices for
 737 Environmental Site Assessments) and/or , at the expense of **Seller** **Buyer** (Environmental Inspection).
 738 In addition, Buyer, at Buyer's expense, may also conduct an evaluation whether the Property complies with the
 739 *Americans with Disabilities Act* (ADA Evaluation). All such inspections and evaluations must be conducted at
 740 such times as are mutually agreeable to minimize the interruption of Seller's and any Seller's tenants' business
 741 uses of the Property, if any.

742 If Buyer's Phase I Environmental Site Assessment recommends a Phase II Environmental Site
 743 Assessment, the **Environmental Inspection Objection Deadline** will be extended by days (Extended
 744 Environmental Inspection Objection Deadline) and if such Extended Environmental Inspection Objection
 745 Deadline extends beyond the **Closing Date**, the **Closing Date** will be extended a like period of time. In such
 746 event, **Seller** **Buyer** must pay the cost for such Phase II Environmental Site Assessment.

747 Notwithstanding Buyer's right to obtain additional environmental inspections of the Property in this §
 748 10.6.5, Buyer has the Right to Terminate under § 25.1, on or before **Environmental Inspection Objection**
 749 **Deadline**, or if applicable, the Extended Environmental Inspection Objection Deadline, based on any
 750 unsatisfactory results of Environmental Inspection, in Buyer's sole subjective discretion.

751 Buyer has the Right to Terminate under § 25.1, on or before **ADA Evaluation Objection Deadline**,
 752 based on any unsatisfactory ADA Evaluation, in Buyer's sole subjective discretion.

753 **10.7. Conditional Upon Sale of Property.** This Contract is conditional upon the sale and closing
 754 of that certain property owned by Buyer and commonly known as . Buyer has the Right to Terminate under §
 755 25.1 effective upon Seller's receipt of Buyer's Notice to Terminate on or before **Conditional Sale Deadline** if
 756 such property is not sold and closed by such deadline. This § 10.7 is for the sole benefit of Buyer. If Seller
 757 does not receive Buyer's Notice to Terminate on or before **Conditional Sale Deadline**, Buyer waives any
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771 Right to Terminate under this provision.
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773 **10.8. Source of Potable Water (Residential Land and Residential Improvements Only).**

774 Buyer Does Does Not acknowledge receipt of a copy of Seller's Property Disclosure or Source of
775 Water Addendum disclosing the source of potable water for the Property. There is **No Well**. Buyer Does
776 Does Not acknowledge receipt of a copy of the current well permit.
777

778 **Note to Buyer: SOME WATER PROVIDERS RELY, TO VARYING DEGREES, ON NONRENEWABLE**
779 **GROUND WATER. YOU MAY WISH TO CONTACT YOUR PROVIDER (OR INVESTIGATE THE DESCRIBED**
780 **SOURCE) TO DETERMINE THE LONG-TERM SUFFICIENCY OF THE PROVIDER'S WATER SUPPLIES.**
781

782 **10.9. Existing Leases; Modification of Existing Leases; New Leases.** Seller states that none
783 of the Leases to be assigned to the Buyer at the time of Closing contain any rent concessions, rent reductions
784 or rent abatements except as disclosed in the Lease or other writing received by Buyer. Seller will not amend,
785 alter, modify, extend or cancel any of the Leases nor will Seller enter into any new leases affecting the Property
786 without the prior written consent of Buyer, which consent will not be unreasonably withheld or delayed.
787

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789 **11. TENANT ESTOPPEL STATEMENTS.**
790

791 **11.1. Tenant Estoppel Statements Conditions.** Buyer has the right to review and object to any
792 Estoppel Statements. Seller must obtain and deliver to Buyer on or before **Tenant Estoppel Statements**
793 **Deadline**, statements in a form and substance reasonably acceptable to Buyer, from each occupant or tenant
794 at the Property (Estoppel Statement) attached to a copy of the Lease stating:
795

796 **11.1.1.** The commencement date of the Lease and scheduled termination date of the Lease;
797

798 **11.1.2.** That said Lease is in full force and effect and that there have been no subsequent
799 modifications or amendments;

800 **11.1.3.** The amount of any advance rentals paid, rent concessions given, and deposits paid
801 to Seller;

802 **11.1.4.** The amount of monthly (or other applicable period) rental paid to Seller;
803

804 **11.1.5.** That there is no default under the terms of said Lease by landlord or occupant; and
805

806 **11.1.6.** That the Lease to which the Estoppel is attached is a true, correct and complete copy
807 of the Lease demising the premises it describes.
808

809 **11.2. Tenant Estoppel Statements Objection.** Buyer has the Right to Terminate under § 25.1, on
810 or before **Tenant Estoppel Statements Objection Deadline**, based on any unsatisfactory Estoppel
811 Statement, in Buyer's sole subjective discretion, or if Seller fails to deliver the Estoppel Statements on or
812 before **Tenant Estoppel Statements Deadline**. Buyer also has the unilateral right to waive any unsatisfactory
813 Estoppel Statement.
814

815 **CLOSING PROVISIONS**
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818 **12. CLOSING DOCUMENTS, INSTRUCTIONS AND CLOSING.**
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820 **12.1. Closing Documents and Closing Information.** Seller and Buyer will cooperate with the Closing
821 Company to enable the Closing Company to prepare and deliver documents required for Closing to Buyer and
822 Seller and their designees. If Buyer is obtaining a new loan to purchase the Property, Buyer acknowledges
823 Buyer's lender is required to provide the Closing Company, in a timely manner, all required loan documents
824 and financial information concerning Buyer's new loan. Buyer and Seller will furnish any additional information
825 and documents required by Closing Company that will be necessary to complete this transaction. Buyer and
826 Seller will sign and complete all customary or reasonably required documents at or before Closing.
827

828 **12.2. Closing Instructions.** Colorado Real Estate Commission's Closing Instructions Are Are
829 **Not** executed with this Contract.
830

831 **12.3. Closing.** Delivery of deed from Seller to Buyer will be at closing (Closing). Closing will be on the
832 date specified as the **Closing Date** or by mutual agreement at an earlier date. The hour and place of Closing
833 will be as designated by **Buyer, Seller and Title Company**.
834

835 **12.4. Disclosure of Settlement Costs.** Buyer and Seller acknowledge that costs, quality, and extent
836 of service vary between different settlement service providers (e.g., attorneys, lenders, inspectors and title
837 companies).
838
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841 **13. TRANSFER OF TITLE.** Subject to tender of payment at Closing as required herein and compliance by
 842 Buyer with the other terms and provisions hereof, Seller must execute and deliver a good and sufficient
 843 **Special Warranty** deed to Buyer, at Closing, conveying the Property free and clear of all taxes except the
 844 general taxes for the year of Closing. Except as provided herein, title will be conveyed free and clear of all
 845 liens, including any governmental liens for special improvements installed as of the date of Buyer's signature
 846 hereon, whether assessed or not. Title will be conveyed subject to:
 847

849 **13.1.** Those specific Exceptions described by reference to recorded documents as reflected in the
 850 Title Documents accepted by Buyer in accordance with **Record Title**,

851 **13.2.** Distribution utility easements (including cable TV),

852 **13.3.** Those specifically described rights of third parties not shown by the public records of which
 853 Buyer has actual knowledge and which were accepted by Buyer in accordance with **Off-Record Title and New**
 854 **ILC or New Survey**,

855 **13.4.** Inclusion of the Property within any special taxing district, and

856 **13.5.** Any special assessment if the improvements were not installed as of the date of Buyer's
 857 signature hereon, whether assessed prior to or after Closing, and

858 **13.6.** Other .

860 **14. PAYMENT OF ENCUMBRANCES.** Any encumbrance required to be paid will be paid at or before
 861 Closing from the proceeds of this transaction or from any other source.

862 **15. CLOSING COSTS, CLOSING FEE, ASSOCIATION FEES AND TAXES.**

863 **15.1. Closing Costs.** Buyer and Seller must pay, in Good Funds, their respective closing costs
 864 and all other items required to be paid at Closing, except as otherwise provided herein.

865 **15.2. Closing Services Fee.** The fee for real estate closing services must be paid at Closing
 866 by Buyer Seller One-Half by Buyer and One-Half by Seller
 867 Other .

868 **15.3. Status Letter and Record Change Fees.** Any fees incident to the issuance of
 869 Association's statement of assessments (Status Letter) must be paid by None Buyer Seller
 870 One-Half by Buyer and One-Half by Seller. Any record change fee assessed by the Association including,
 871 but not limited to, ownership record transfer fees regardless of name or title of such fee (Association's Record
 872 Change Fee) must be paid by None Buyer Seller One-Half by Buyer and One-Half by
 873 Seller.

874 **15.4. Local Transfer Tax.** The Local Transfer Tax of % of the Purchase Price must be paid
 875 at Closing by None Buyer Seller One-Half by Buyer and One-Half by Seller.

876 **15.5. Private Transfer Fee.** Private transfer fees and other fees due to a transfer of the Property,
 877 payable at Closing, such as community association fees, developer fees and foundation fees, must be paid at
 878 Closing by None Buyer Seller One-Half by Buyer and One-Half by Seller. The Private Transfer
 879 fee, whether one or more, is for the following association(s): in the total amount of na% of the Purchase Price
 880 or \$.

881 **15.6. Water Transfer Fees.** The Water Transfer Fees can change. The fees, as of the date of
 882 this Contract, do not exceed \$ for:

 885 None Buyer Seller One-Half by Buyer and One-Half by Seller

886 **15.7. Sales and Use Tax.** Any sales and use tax that may accrue because of this transaction
 887 must be paid when due by None Buyer Seller One-Half by Buyer and One-Half by Seller.

888 **16. PRORATIONS.** The following will be prorated to the **Closing Date**, except as otherwise provided:

889 **16.1. Taxes.** Personal property taxes, if any, special taxing district assessments, if any, and
 890 general real estate taxes for the year of Closing, based on Taxes for the Calendar Year Immediately
 891 Preceding Closing Most Recent Mill Levy and Most Recent Assessed Valuation, Other .

911 **16.2. Rents.** Rents based on **Rents Actually Received** **Accrued**. At Closing, Seller will
 912 transfer or credit to Buyer the security deposits for all Leases assigned, or any remainder after lawful
 913 deductions, and notify all tenants in writing of such transfer and of the transferee's name and address. Seller
 914 must assign to Buyer all Leases in effect at Closing and Buyer must assume Seller's obligations under such
 915 Leases.
 916

917 **16.3. Association Assessments.** Current regular Association assessments and dues
 918 (Association Assessments) paid in advance will be credited to Seller at Closing. Cash reserves held out of the
 919 regular Association Assessments for deferred maintenance by the Association will not be credited to Seller
 920 except as may be otherwise provided by the Governing Documents. Buyer acknowledges that Buyer may be
 921 obligated to pay the Association, at Closing, an amount for reserves or working capital. Any special
 922 assessment assessed prior to **Closing Date** by the Association will be the obligation of **Buyer** **Seller**.
 923 Except however, any special assessment by the Association for improvements that have been installed as of
 924 the date of Buyer's signature hereon, whether assessed prior to or after Closing, will be the obligation of Seller.
 925 Seller represents that the Association Assessments are currently payable at approximately \$ 277 per
 926 month and that there are no unpaid regular or special assessments against the Property except the current
 927 regular assessments and . Such assessments are subject to change as provided in the Governing Documents.
 928 Seller agrees to promptly request the Association to deliver to Buyer before **Closing Date** a current Status
 929 Letter.
 930

931 **16.4. Other Prorations.** Water and sewer charges, propane, interest on continuing loan, and .
 932

933 **16.5. Final Settlement.** Unless otherwise agreed in writing, these prorations are final.
 934

935 **17. POSSESSION.** Possession of the Property will be delivered to Buyer on **Possession Date** at
 936 **Possession Time**, subject to the Leases as set forth in § 10.6.1.7.
 937

938 If Seller, after Closing, fails to deliver possession as specified, Seller will be subject to eviction and
 939 will be additionally liable to Buyer for payment of \$ 250.00 per day (or any part of a day notwithstanding §
 940 18.1) from **Possession Date** and **Possession Time** until possession is delivered.
 941

GENERAL PROVISIONS

942 **18. DAY; COMPUTATION OF PERIOD OF DAYS, DEADLINE.**
 943

944 **18.1. Day.** As used in this Contract, the term "day" means the entire day ending at 11:59 p.m., United
 945 States Mountain Time (Standard or Daylight Savings as applicable).
 946

947 **18.2. Computation of Period of Days, Deadline.** In computing a period of days, when the ending
 948 date is not specified, the first day is excluded and the last day is included (e.g., three days after MEC). If any
 949 deadline falls on a Saturday, Sunday or federal or Colorado state holiday (Holiday), such deadline **Will**
 950 **Will Not** be extended to the next day that is not a Saturday, Sunday or Holiday. Should neither box be
 951 checked, the deadline will not be extended.
 952

953 **19. CAUSES OF LOSS, INSURANCE; DAMAGE TO INCLUSIONS AND SERVICES; CONDEMNATION;
 954 AND WALK-THROUGH.** Except as otherwise provided in this Contract, the Property, Inclusions or both will be
 955 delivered in the condition existing as of the date of this Contract, ordinary wear and tear excepted.
 956

957 **19.1. Causes of Loss, Insurance.** In the event the Property or Inclusions are damaged by fire, other
 958 perils or causes of loss prior to Closing in an amount of not more than ten percent of the total Purchase Price
 959 (Property Damage), and if the repair of the damage will be paid by insurance (other than the deductible to be
 960 paid by Seller), then Seller, upon receipt of the insurance proceeds, will use Seller's reasonable efforts to
 961 repair the Property before **Closing Date**. Buyer has the Right to Terminate under § 25.1, on or before **Closing**
 962 **Date** if the Property is not repaired before **Closing Date** or if the damage exceeds such sum. Should Buyer
 963 elect to carry out this Contract despite such Property Damage, Buyer is entitled to a credit at Closing for all
 964 insurance proceeds that were received by Seller (but not the Association, if any) resulting from damage to the
 965 Property and Inclusions, plus the amount of any deductible provided for in the insurance policy. This credit may
 966 not exceed the Purchase Price. In the event Seller has not received the insurance proceeds prior to Closing,
 967 the parties may agree to extend the **Closing Date** to have the Property repaired prior to Closing or, at the
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981 option of Buyer, (1) Seller must assign to Buyer the right to the proceeds at Closing, if acceptable to Seller's
 982 insurance company and Buyer's lender; or (2) the parties may enter into a written agreement prepared by the

987 **19.2. Damage, Inclusions and Services.** Should any Inclusion or service (including utilities and
 988 communication services), system, component or fixture of the Property (collectively Service) (e.g., heating or
 989 plumbing), fail or be damaged between the date of this Contract and Closing or possession, whichever is
 990 earlier, then Seller is liable for the repair or replacement of such Inclusion or Service with a unit of similar size,
 991 age and quality, or an equivalent credit, but only to the extent that the maintenance or replacement of such
 992 Inclusion or Service is not the responsibility of the Association, if any, less any insurance proceeds received by
 993 Buyer covering such repair or replacement. If the failed or damaged Inclusion or Service is not repaired or
 994 replaced on or before Closing or possession, whichever is earlier, Buyer has the Right to Terminate under §
 995 25.1, on or before **Closing Date**, or, at the option of Buyer, Buyer is entitled to a credit at Closing for the repair
 996 or replacement of such Inclusion or Service. Such credit must not exceed the Purchase Price. If Buyer
 997 receives such a credit, Seller's right for any claim against the Association, if any, will survive Closing. Seller
 998 and Buyer are aware of the existence of pre-owned home warranty programs that may be purchased and may
 999 cover the repair or replacement of such Inclusions.

1001 **19.3. Condemnation.** In the event Seller receives actual notice prior to Closing that a pending
 1002 condemnation action may result in a taking of all or part of the Property or Inclusions, Seller must promptly
 1003 notify Buyer, in writing, of such condemnation action. Buyer has the Right to Terminate under § 25.1, on or
 1004 before **Closing Date**, based on such condemnation action, in Buyer's sole subjective discretion. Should Buyer
 1005 elect to consummate this Contract despite such diminution of value to the Property and Inclusions, Buyer is
 1006 entitled to a credit at Closing for all condemnation proceeds awarded to Seller for the diminution in the value of

1014 **19.5. Risk of Loss - Growing Crops.** The risk of loss for damage to growing crops by fire or other

 1016 to such insurance proceeds or benefits for the growing crops.

1018 **20. RECOMMENDATION OF LEGAL AND TAX COUNSEL.** By signing this Contract, Buyer and Seller
 1019 acknowledge that the respective broker has advised that this Contract has important legal consequences and
 1020 has recommended the examination of title and consultation with legal and tax or other counsel before signing
 1021 this Contract.
 1022

1023 **21. TIME OF ESSENCE, DEFAULT AND REMEDIES.** Time is of the essence for all dates and deadlines
 1024 in this Contract. This means that all dates and deadlines are strict and absolute. If any payment due, including
 1025 Earnest Money, is not paid, honored or tendered when due, or if any obligation is not performed timely as
 1026 provided in this Contract or waived, the non-defaulting party has the following remedies:
 1027

1028 **21.1. If Buyer is in Default:**

1029 **21.1.1. Specific Performance.** Seller may elect to cancel this Contract and all Earnest
 1030 Money (whether or not paid by Buyer) will be paid to Seller and retained by Seller. It is agreed that the Earnest
 1031 Money is not a penalty, and the Parties agree the amount is fair and reasonable. Seller may recover such
 1032 additional damages as may be proper. Alternatively, Seller may elect to treat this Contract as being in full force
 1033 and effect and Seller has the right to specific performance or damages, or both.
 1034

1035 **21.1.2. Liquidated Damages, Applicable. This § 21.1.2 applies unless the box in § 21.1.1.**
 1036 **is checked.** Seller may cancel this Contract. All Earnest Money (whether or not paid by Buyer) will be paid to
 1037 Seller, and retained by Seller. It is agreed that the Earnest Money specified in § 4.1 is LIQUIDATED
 1038 DAMAGES, and not a penalty, which amount the parties agree is fair and reasonable and (except as provided
 1039 in §§ 10.4, 22, 23 and 24), said payment of Earnest Money is SELLER'S ONLY REMEDY for Buyer's failure to
 1040

1051 perform the obligations of this Contract. Seller expressly waives the remedies of specific performance and
 1052 additional damages.

1053 **21.2. If Seller is in Default:** Buyer may elect to treat this Contract as canceled, in which case all
 1054 Earnest Money received hereunder will be returned and Buyer may recover such damages as may be proper.
 1055 Alternatively, Buyer may elect to treat this Contract as being in full force and effect and Buyer has the right to
 1056 specific performance or damages, or both.

1060 **22. LEGAL FEES, COST AND EXPENSES.** Anything to the contrary herein notwithstanding, in the event
 1061 of any arbitration or litigation relating to this Contract, prior to or after **Closing Date**, the arbitrator or court must
 1062 award to the prevailing party all reasonable costs and expenses, including attorney fees, legal fees and
 1063 expenses.

1066 **23. MEDIATION.** If a dispute arises relating to this Contract, (whether prior to or after Closing) and is not
 1067 resolved, the parties must first proceed, in good faith, to mediation. Mediation is a process in which the parties
 1068 meet with an impartial person who helps to resolve the dispute informally and confidentially. Mediators cannot
 1069 impose binding decisions. Before any mediated settlement is binding, the parties to the dispute must agree to
 1070 the settlement, in writing. The parties will jointly appoint an acceptable mediator and will share equally in the
 1071 cost of such mediation. The obligation to mediate, unless otherwise agreed, will terminate if the entire dispute
 1072 is not resolved within thirty days of the date written notice requesting mediation is delivered by one party to the
 1073 other at that party's last known address (physical or electronic as provided in § 27). Nothing in this Section
 1074 prohibits either party from filing a lawsuit and recording a *lis pendens* affecting the Property, before or after the

1082 **24. EARNEST MONEY DISPUTE.** Except as otherwise provided herein, Earnest Money Holder must
 1083 release the Earnest Money following receipt of written mutual instructions, signed by both Buyer and Seller. In
 1084 the event of any controversy regarding the Earnest Money, Earnest Money Holder is not required to release
 1085 the Earnest Money. Earnest Money Holder, in its sole subjective discretion, has several options: (1) wait for
 1086 any proceeding between Buyer and Seller; (2) interplead all parties and deposit Earnest Money into a court of
 1087 competent jurisdiction, (Earnest Money Holder is entitled to recover court costs and reasonable attorney and
 1088 legal fees incurred with such action); or (3) provide notice to Buyer and Seller that unless Earnest Money

 1094 obligation of **Mediation**. This Section will survive cancellation or termination of this Contract.

1100 **25. TERMINATION.**

1101 **25.1. Right to Terminate.** If a party has a right to terminate, as provided in this Contract (Right to
 1102 Terminate), the termination is effective upon the other party's receipt of a written notice to terminate (Notice to
 1103 Terminate), provided such written notice was received on or before the applicable deadline specified in this
 1104 Contract. If the Notice to Terminate is not received on or before the specified deadline, the party with the Right
 1105 to Terminate accepts the specified matter, document or condition as satisfactory and waives the Right to

1109 **25.2. Effect of Termination.** In the event this Contract is terminated, all Earnest Money received

1114 **26. ENTIRE AGREEMENT, MODIFICATION, SURVIVAL; SUCCESSORS.** This Contract, its exhibits and
 1115 specified addenda, constitute the entire agreement between the parties relating to the subject hereof, and any
 1116 prior agreements pertaining thereto, whether oral or written, have been merged and integrated into this
 1117 Contract. No subsequent modification of any of the terms of this Contract is valid, binding upon the parties, or

1121 enforceable unless made in writing and signed by the parties. Any right or obligation in this Contract that, by its
 1122 terms, exists or is intended to be performed after termination or Closing survives the same. Any successor to a
 1123 Party receives the predecessor's benefits and obligations of this Contract.

1126 **27. NOTICE, DELIVERY, AND CHOICE OF LAW.**

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ADDENDUM A

To Contract to Buy and Sell Real Estate

This Addendum A to that certain Contract to Buy and Sell Real Estate dated October 29, 2018, between Frank Goldsmith, Buyer, and Sachs Bridge Investments LLC, Seller, for the property known as Subdivision: RIVER VALLEY RANCH PH 7 Block: Z Lot: 3, 16877 SQ FT, Section: 10, Township: 8, Range: 88 and commonly known as 218 Crystal Canyon Drive, Carbondale, CO 81623, CO, 81623 ("Contract") is hereby made a part of the Contract, as referenced in Section 31.1 of the Contract. In the event of a conflict between this Addendum and the Contract, this Addendum shall prevail. The Sections indicated below clarify or amend, as appropriate, the corresponding Section in the Contract.

The following provisions are hereby added as Additional Provisions to Section 30 of the Contract:

§30.1. Proof of Funds. Buyer shall provide verified proof of funds on or before the Alternative Earnest Money Deadline in an amount not less than the amount stated as Cash at Closing in Paragraph 4.1.

§30.2. Pending Litigation. Seller is a limited liability company wholly owned by Woodbridge Group of Companies, LLC ("Woodbridge"). Seller and Woodbridge have each filed petitions under chapter 11 of the Bankruptcy Code and there is pending litigation against and/or involving Seller and Woodbridge, which could affect the Property or Seller's ability to convey title to the Property or obtain a release of any deeds of trust encumbering the Property prior to Closing, including Case No. 17-12560-KJC in the United States Bankruptcy Court for the District of Delaware, as well as Case No. 17-24624-CIV, in the United States District Court, Southern District of Florida.

§30.3. Approval of Bankruptcy Court. Seller is a Debtor in jointly-administered bankruptcy Case No. 17-12560-KJC in the United States Bankruptcy Court for the District of Delaware (the "Bankruptcy Court"). This Agreement, including Seller's obligation to transfer title free and clear of all liens in Paragraph 13, is expressly contingent upon the Bankruptcy Court's entry of a final, non-appealable order approving this Agreement ("Sale Order") on or prior to Closing, and any transaction(s) contained herein, including payment or escrow of the brokerage commission as well as the conveyance of the Property free and clear of all monetary liens and encumbrances. Seller will use reasonable efforts to file a motion for approval of this Agreement with the Bankruptcy Court promptly after Buyer has confirmed in writing that all Buyer objection and resolution deadlines or any other contingency periods have lapsed or have been waived consistent with Paragraph 30.9 below. If the Sale Order has not been approved by the Bankruptcy Court on or before 180 days after MEC (the "Sale Order Deadline"), then Buyer may elect to terminate the Contract upon written notice to Seller at any time after the Sale Order Deadline, with all Earnest Money refunded to Buyer. Unless and until Buyer exercises the right to terminate as set forth in this Paragraph, the Sale Order Deadline will be deemed extended, until the earlier of (i) Buyer's written notice of termination to Seller or (ii) receipt by Buyer of the Sale Order. Notwithstanding foregoing, if the Bankruptcy Court issues an order denying the sale of the Property, or if the Sale Order is appealed after approval by any party in the Bankruptcy Court, then this Contract will automatically terminate upon Seller's written notice to Buyer of the same and all Earnest Money will be returned to Buyer.

§30.4. Parties' Approval of Sale Order. Upon issuance of the Sale Order by the Bankruptcy Court, Seller will deliver the Sale Order to Buyer. Buyer and Seller will have 3 business days from delivery of the Sale Order to Buyer to review and approve the Sale Order ("Sale Order Approval Deadline"). Either party, in its reasonable discretion, may elect to terminate the Contract by written notice to the other party by the Sale Order Approval Deadline if the Sale Order amends or alters any material term or condition of the Contract (e.g., purchase price, or any Schedule B-1 requirement of the Title Commitment issued by the Title Company) and such amended term or condition imposes an undue burden on either party as a requirement of closing. If neither party provides the other party with a notice to terminate by the Sale Order Approval Deadline, the Sale Order will be deemed approved by both parties. Closing shall occur within five (5) days after the Sale Order becomes final and non-appealable.

§30.5. Buyer's Remedies. Paragraph 21.2 shall be deleted and replaced with the following: 21.2. If Seller is in Default: Buyer may elect to treat this Contract as canceled, in which case all Earnest Money received hereunder will be returned. Said payment of Earnest Money is Buyer's Only Remedy for Seller's failure to perform the obligations of this Contract. Buyer expressly waives all additional remedies, including the remedies of specific performance and additional damages.

§30.6. Property and Inclusions Sold "As Is." Buyer is hereby notified that the property is being sold "As Is" and "With All Faults" based upon Buyer's own investigation(s). Seller shall neither undertake any repairs to the property nor make any financial concessions in consideration of any objections Buyer may have to the physical condition of the property. This provision does not limit Buyer's rights under Paragraph 10 of the Contract.

§30.7. Property Disclosures; Reliance. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the Contract, Buyer acknowledges and agrees that Seller will not provide and is under no obligation or duty to provide any information or disclosures regarding the Property. If any information is provided by Seller ("Information"), then it is provided by Seller to Buyer "as-is", without recourse, and with no representations or warranties of any kind, including without limitation as to the accuracy or completeness of such documents or information. Buyer cannot rely on the Information unless Buyer obtains, at Buyer's expense, reliance letters from any third-party preparers of such information. Not in limitation of the foregoing, Buyer acknowledges and agrees that Seller shall have no liability, and is hereby released from all liability, to Buyer and any third party, with respect to the Information, including without limitation any liability for misrepresentations, misstatements, mistakes, errors, or other inaccuracies contained in any Information. This Paragraph shall survive Closing and any termination of this Contract, any other provision hereof to the contrary notwithstanding.

§30.8. Buyer's Diligence. Buyer warrants and represents to Seller that Buyer is relying solely on Buyer's own investigation of the Property and Inclusions and not on any information provided or to be provided by Seller; Buyer will review and investigate the property and any improvements on it and Inclusions as Buyer deems necessary and appropriate and will consult such records, outside resources, consultants and engineers as Buyer deems appropriate; and Buyer's decision to purchase the Property and Inclusions will be based solely on that review, investigation, and consultation. If Buyer acquires the Property and Inclusions, Buyer will be doing so in its then present condition.

§30.9. Buyer's Confirmation of Completed Diligence. Within 3 days after the expiration of the final objection and/or resolution deadline, or earlier in Buyer's discretion, Buyer shall confirm in writing that all contingencies have expired by providing the following notice to Seller in writing:

§30.10. Attorney Review. This Contract is contingent upon the satisfactory review of the Contract by the Buyer’s and Seller’s respective attorneys within five (5) business days of MEC. In the event any of the legal provisions of the Contract are deemed unsatisfactory by either attorney, such attorney shall provide the other party with written notice of the unsatisfactory provision within a five (5) business days of MEC. If neither party provides such written notice within such period, this contingency shall be deemed satisfied. If written notice of an unsatisfactory provision is provided within such period, and the Buyer and Seller have not executed an amendment to the Contract in mutual resolution of the unsatisfactory provision within seven (7) business days of complete execution of this Contract, then this Contract shall be deemed terminated. Upon termination, all earnest monies shall be returned to Buyer and both parties shall be relieved of all further obligations hereunder.
